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Policy Subject: Termination of Non-Emergency Follow-up Services Per Bulletin MSA 20-40 - COVID-19 Response: Emergency Services Only Beneficiaries and Coverage of Testing and Treatment of COVID-19

Affected Programs: Emergency Services Only (ESO)

Policy Summary: This policy notifies providers of the termination of the non-emergency COVID-19 follow-up services described in Bulletin MSA 20-40 - COVID-19 Response: Emergency Services Only Beneficiaries and Coverage of Testing and Treatment of COVID-19.

Purpose: Bulletin MSA 20-40, effective March 10, 2020 consistent with public health emergency (PHE) conditions at both the state and federal level related to COVID-19, was intended to be time-limited. Follow-up care to emergency treatment for a diagnosis of COVID-19 is no longer covered for emergency services only beneficiaries beginning the day after the end of the PHE.

Programs Affected: Emergency Services Only (ESO)

Bulletin MSA 20-40, issued on May 11, 2020, states that in addition to currently covered ESO services, medically necessary COVID-19 testing, treatment, and follow-up services provided to ESO beneficiaries are covered until the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) notifies providers of its termination. This policy notifies providers that non-emergency COVID-19 follow-up services described in MSA 20-40 are no longer covered beginning for dates of service on May 12, 2023, the day following the end of the federal COVID-19 Public Health Emergency (PHE). COVID-19 testing and treatment services will continue to be covered. Refer to the Emergency Services Only Medicaid chapter of the MDHHS Medicaid Provider Manual for additional information regarding specific coverage under the ESO program.
