



**MBDR Newsblast 12: Comprehensive List of ICD-10 Reportable Codes Posted
Tuesday January 9, 2024**

The Michigan Birth Defects Registry (MBDR) was established as part of the Public Health Code (Act 368 of 1978). Confidentiality of all data is required by law and strictly maintained by the Health Department staff. Section 2631 of the Public Health Code regulates procedures protecting confidentiality and regulating disclosure of data and records. Birth Defects Surveillance Authorization, Public Act 236 of 1988 established the statewide Birth Defects Registry.

Comprehensive List of ICD-10 Reportable Conditions through 2024 POSTED

The Comprehensive List of ICD-10 Reportable Birth Defects codes has been updated to include all codes through 2024. These required updates need to be IMMEDIATELY implemented into your facility's reporting process. This list is from the National Birth Defects Prevention Network (NBDPN) recommendations and what the State of Michigan collects.
