


Participating in the Virtual Forum


- If you would like to respond verbally to a question:



Vision for a Five-Year Health IT Roadmap: A brief history

2005

- Governor Jennifer M.
 Granholm announces efforts
 to explore the role of IT in
 healthcare transformation
 and improving care
 outcomes
- The Michigan Department of Community Health and Department of Information Technology are charged with convening stakeholders to develop a strategy

2006

- 200+ healthcare stakeholders are convened
- The "Conduit to Care" strategy document is published
- The legislature establishes the Health IT Commission
- Federal and state funding is secured to implement plan

Vision for a Five-Year Health IT Roadmap: Strategic planning during a global pandemic

2019

- The Health IT Commission adopts a resolution to update the "Conduit to Care" strategy
- The Michigan Health Endowment Fund awards funding for the development of an updated Five-Year Health IT Roadmap

2020

- The coronavirus pandemic puts strain on care delivery systems
- Engagement for the roadmap is reimagined for virtual spaces
- 650+ healthcare, social service and consumer stakeholders are engaged
- Virtual forums are scheduled






5-Year Health IT Roadmap



Theme #1 – Homelessness data

We heard that care coordination for homeless populations with behavioral health conditions could be improved




- How could your organization leverage homelessness data to benefit clients?
- What barriers might be in place that could limit actionable insights about homelessness?
- What could some solutions be?

Theme #2 – BH data standardization

Work is needed to define common data fields for capturing and sharing information related to mental health

What kinds of actions might be most helpful to support development of a set of common data elements to support coordination of care for individuals with behavioral health needs?

- How could the state or other partners better lead these efforts (e.g. policy, training, etc.)?
- We heard that a statewide e-consent system is a top priority. Are there data sets that need to be better standardized to enable e-consent to succeed?




Theme #3 — Connections to social services

There was mention of need to better incorporate information related to social determinants of health, social needs, history of trauma, and other information likely to factor into an individual's health and well-being into the behavioral health workflow.

What support does your organization need to integrate these data sets?

- Is there support needed from the state? From MiHIN?
 From fellow organization partners?
- What is the biggest barrier to connecting with this information? Consent concerns? Technical barriers? Other resistance?




Theme #4 – Telemedicine

The pandemic has facilitated the use of more telehealth for behavioral health conditions.

- Use of telehealth has reduced no-show rates
- Improved ability to coordinate care with vulnerable populations

- What is needed further integrate telehealth services in your organization?
- Is there anything the state could do to help support behavioral health providers with telehealth services?



Theme #5 - Data Quality



Data Availability

Are there specific improvements that could be made to state or commercial data feeds that could enhance data quality?

Data Accuracy

Are there specific data sets that are not useable due to significant time delays or outdated information? What is needed to enable more real-time data sharing to providers?

What are your top two priorities for the roadmap to address, based on the themes identified in the Discovery Forum?



High Level Timeline for Roadmap Development Process

September 2021 Final Draft Roadmap for HITC and MDHHS acceptance/approval

Q2 2021 - Q3 2021

- Draft Roadmap with recommendations for HITC consideration
- Present draft Roadmap to HITC
- Conduct feedback process to validate stakeholder support for Roadmap
- Make necessary revisions

Q3 2020 - Q1 2021

- Engage Stakeholders in Environmental Scan
- Review historical documents
- Synthesize input
- Ensure "directional correctness" with guidance from RSC
- Update HITC




