RE: Collaborative Care as a Preventive service

To whom it may concern:

The United States is in the midst of a public health crisis in Behavioral Health care. Suicide in particular has risen steadily in the population for the past several years, American Academy of Pediatrics has dubbed the crisis in children a emergency. Our Commission has reviewed the literature to determine ways to stem the tide of increase in suicide and one method is to use screening of the population especially in the primary care office as a tool to identify people at risk and intervene. In Michigan and elsewhere in te country Collaborative Care has been increasingly incorporated into the routine care of patient at the primary care level. Characteristics of the process are intensive screening for behavioral health issues, early intervention with trained behavioral health care managers within the practice and psychiatric influence on the treatment and referral of patients immediately through the Psychiatric consultant to the practice. CoCM is evidence based with more than 160 peer reviewed publications, Measurement driven utilizing the disease appropriate peer reviewed tools, and outcome focused with weekly reviews of patient progress in treatment by a team of physicians, psychiatrists, and behavioral health care managers as well as the entire treatment team to coordinate the care.

I the area of suicide prevention there are several article s su0prt the Collaborative care(CoCM) process as an effective mechanism to identify and therefore prevent and treat suicidal thinking intent and plans all end goals of the preventive designation for the USPSTF mission. Having eh screening and intervention at the time of the yearly preventive visit would screen hundreds of thousands o millions of people for this issue and likely save peoples lives. Nothing is more preventive in nature than stopping someone from killing themselves.

MINUTES

Agenda Items:

1. Call to Order – Brian Ahmedani

a. Roll Call

Brian Ahmedani called the May 2023 Michigan Suicide Prevention Commission Meeting to order at 10:34 AM.

The roll was taken, and a quorum of members were not present.

b. New Member Introduction

Carol Zuniga introduced herself to Commission as one of the newest members.

2. Public Comment

There was no public comment provided at this time.

3. Review and Adopt Previous Meeting Minutes – All

March 2023 Meeting Minutes could not be approved due to lack of quorum.

4. MDHHS Updates

a. Behavioral Health and Forensic Programs

i. MiCAL/988 Implementation – Krista Hausermann

Krista Hausermann (MDHHS) reported the Michigan Legislature has passed a law to stand up crisis stabilization units and crisis receiving units similar to behavioral health emergency departments. This will allow anyone who shows up to receive support while they are in crisis. MDHHS is not anticipating starting those for another 12 to 18 months.

988 has been live for just over a year in Michigan. A few key milestones and accomplishments since July 1, 2022:

- 17,800+ total hours spent on the phone with Michiganders.
- 50,500+ total number of 988 calls answered in Michigan.
- 4.5 out of 1,000 calls led to 911 emergency intervention.
- 39,300+ unique 988 callers.
- 19.4 seconds is the average speed of answer

b. Injury Violence Prevention Section – Jennifer DeLaCruz/Pat Smith
Pat Smith’s last day of service is today. The Commission would like to recognize Pat for her commitment to suicide prevention efforts within the state.

- i. Preventing Suicide in Michigan Men (PRiSMM) – Megan Scott
There are ASMR trainings scheduled for the summer – June 28, July 26, and August 9.

The department is providing another TEMPOS (Tool for Evaluating Media Portrayals of Suicide) webinar in collaboration with Stanford and University of Michigan. The webinar will be on June 21, 2023 at noon.

PRiSMM is preparing for the third community scan as required by the grant.

- ii. Transforming Youth Suicide Prevention (TYSP) - Lindsay DeCamp
The Suicide Prevention Technical Assistance Conference was held in the beginning of May. There was some great coalition building that took place during the pre-conference. MDHHS is looking forward to the conference next year.

The team also applied for a SAMHSA national suicide prevention strategy grant. The application focuses on the older adult population.

The suicide preventions state plan is currently in draft form and the department is looking forward to finalizing and preparing for dissemination.

5. Subcommittee Workgroup Updates – James Bell III

- i. The Licensure Subcommittee met at the end of April and is still refining which licensed profession should be targeted for suicide prevention training requirements. Dr. Beecroft is working with a colleague to draft a letter for legislators. A future meeting will be scheduled once the letter had been drafted.

- ii. The Death Scene Investigation Workgroup has been working with the Michigan State Police to integrate the form into its existing processes. Future meetings will be scheduled to keep this conversation going. The group will continue to explore other local jurisdictions.

6. Old Business

- a. Statewide Summit Planning – Nancy Buyle
Nancy Buyle reached out to the K12 Mental Health Commission Chair to explore overlapping responsibilities. The Statewide Summit could also take place during next year's CTAC. Research has been done on what other states have done to highlight this work.

There is funding available from the Commission that could support this effort.

7. New Business

- a. LGBTQ+ Youth Media Campaign – Megan Scott
The LGBTQ media campaign will focus on youth and young adults ages 14 to 24. The funding will enable the department to share advertisements on social media including Facebook, Instagram, and Reddit.
- b. Prevent Block Grant FY24 Update – James Bell III
The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has provided an additional \$20,000 for Local Health Services to allocate for another Prevent Block Grant. The Suicide Prevention Commission will be producing another campaign on firearm suicide prevention, and means reduction. It has not yet been approved, but these are the proposed activities.

8. Other Updates

- a. Policy Update – Corbin Standley
The Policy Update was provided earlier in the week.
- b. Other Updates
Sarah Derwin reported there is a local campaign in the upper peninsula including "one more day" as a way to encourage people to be hopeful. There is also going to be a version written in the Anishinaabe Ojibwe language with an encouraging statement.

9. Next Steps

- a. Action Item Recap – James Bell III
MDHHS will share 988 Call data with the Commission.
MDHHS will prepare a budget presentation for a future Commission meeting based on the initial appropriation.
MDHHS will connect with the commission on K-12 Mental Health and Safety to see if there were other ways the group could work together.

Tanisha Taylor and Michael Pyne provided public comment.
