Certificate of Need (CON) Review Standards for Cardiac Catheterization Services Standards Advisory Committee (CC SAC)

Pursuant to Section 22215(1)(l) of Public Act 368 of 1978, as amended, the CON Commission has determined that a SAC be convened to assist in the development of revisions to the CON Review Standards for Cardiac Catheterization, (CC) Services. The charge to the SAC is as follows:

The Cardiac Catheterization Services SAC is charged with reviewing and recommend any necessary changes to the CC Services CON Standards regarding the following:

1. Review and if necessary, add the designated rural hospital definition.
2. Review the term "Cardiology" within section 10(1)(j)(iv) and if necessary, recommend language.
3. Determine if there is an access issue for PCI services in rural areas. If so, recommend language to improve access.
4. Consider if revisions are needed for the open-heart surgical backup requirement for CardioMEMS implantations.
5. Review Section 12(3)(d) and 12(4)(c) and determine if provisions are needed for the 20-mile distance between existing and proposed services.
6. Review the type of facility listed under section 10(2)(g) and 10(2)(k).
7. Update section 2(1)(s) definition for consistency on the type of facility that can offer additional services at an EPCI facility.
8. Update Section 10(4)(a) to include annual requirements to perform 10 right-sided ablations for a facility to do left-sided ablations.
9. Review Section 4(2) and if necessary, recommend language to allow the initiation of left-sided ablations to be performed in an Ambulatory Surgical Center (ASC).
10. Consider any other technical changes from the Department, e.g., updates or modifications consistent with other CON review standards and the Michigan Public Health Code.

The SAC shall complete its duties and submit its recommendations to the Commission within six months of the first meeting of the SAC. An individual shall serve on no more than two SACs in any two-year period.

The composition of a SAC shall not include a lobbyist registered under 1978 PA 472, MCL 4.411 to 4.431, but shall include all of the following: experts with professional competence in the subject matter of the proposed standard, who shall constitute a 2/3 majority of the SAC; representatives of health care provider organizations concerned with licensed health facilities or licensed health professions; and representatives of organizations concerned with health care consumers and the purchasers and payers of health care services.
