## Speaker Bios

### **Amy Brown: MSN, RN, NE-BC**

Amy Brown has been a registered nurse for more than 20 years and is a board-certified nurse executive. She received her Bachelor of Science in Nursing from Grand Valley State University and her Master of Science in Nursing from Ferris State University. Brown joined the Michigan Health & Hospital Association (MHA) in 2024 as the organization's first chief nursing officer. Prior to joining the MHA, she spent most of her career at a 500+ bed acute care Level 1 Trauma Center. Brown started her chief nursing officer career in March 2020, just a couple weeks into a global pandemic, and served in that role for more than three years. She is an authentic leader, focused on transparent, ethical behavior, leading with her head and her heart. Her role at MHA is to convene nurse leaders, seek input, disseminate best practices and drive positive change with a unified voice to influence health care transformation – ensuring the perspective and needs of nurse leaders are heard and addressed in public policy issues related to nursing and patient care.

Brown also co-leads the MHA Keystone Center providing clinical counsel for the ever-critical work of quality and safety. She serves on the board of the Michigan Organization for Nursing Leadership and has been a member of the American Organization for Nursing Leadership (AONL) for more than 10 years. Brown also completed AONL's Nurse Executive Fellowship in April of 2021. She currently serves on the board for Lawrence Technological University's Healthcare Violence Reduction Center and on the Advisory Board for the Gift of Life Michigan.

### **Wanda Chukwu: DNP, MSN, MA, CNEcl, RN**

Dr. Wanda Chukwu is a dedicated registered nurse who passionately advocates for strategies to enhance nurses' well-being and foster a culture of respect for the vital work they perform in today's increasingly complex health care environment. She received a Bachelors degree in Nursing from Bloomsburg University of PA, a Masters degree in Public Administration from Northern Michigan University, and a Doctor of Nursing Practice degree from Rush University.

With nearly 20 years of bedside and supervisory experience, she brings expertise in transformational leadership and systems management. Dr. Medvec serves as the Faculty Program Lead for the fully digital Masters of Science in Nursing for Leadership, Administration and Innovation (LAI) at the University, a fully digital program. Dr. Medvec's scholarship and practice focuses on nursing workforce, practice environments and innovation. She with UM colleagues led the 2020 and 2022 Study of Michigan Nurses Workforce publishing and presenting on *Patterns and correlates of nurse departures from the health care workforce: Results from a statewide survey* as well *Nurses' perceptions of licensure compact legislation to facilitate interstate practice: Results from the 2022 Michigan nurses' study* and *Registered Nurses' Well Being, Michigan 2022*.

In addition, Dr. Medvec has completed several grant funded programs to offer learning via extended and virtual reality simulation via a variety of methods. She is the co-director for an online learning course has just launched on the Coursera platform for international leaders. This three-part series is on Leadership for Healthcare Professionals. She has served on a variety of national, state, and local organizations and currently is the Secretary for the Coalition of Michigan Organizations for Nursing COMON and is the current President for the ANA-Michigan Nursing Association.

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## Larissa Miller: PhD, RN

Larissa Miller is an assistant professor and coordinator of Professional Development for the College of Nursing at Michigan State University. Larissa has been a nurse educator for over 20 years, serving as a clinical hospital educator, lead professor, campus curriculum chairperson and simulation program coordinator.
