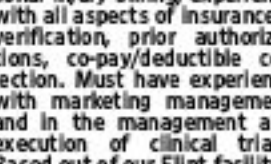

RE: Behavioral Health Home (BHH) Expansion

This letter, in compliance with Section 1902(a)(73) and Section 2107(e)(1)(C) of the Social Security Act, serves as notice to all Tribal Chairs and Health Directors of the intent by the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) to submit a State Plan Amendment (SPA) request to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) to amend Michigan's current BHH SPA (#20-1005) for beneficiaries with Serious Mental Illness/Serious Emotional Disturbance (SMI/SED).

The BHH currently provides comprehensive care management and coordination services to Medicaid beneficiaries with select SMI/SED diagnoses in Michigan's Prepaid Inpatient Health Plan (PIHP) Regions 1, 2, and 8. This SPA will expand the BHH to more geographic areas including PIHP Regions 6 and 7. The BHH expansion will be implemented as it currently is today in regions 1, 2, and 8 where the Lead Entity (e.g., a PIHP) is charged with the administrative oversight and payment for health home activities. The lead entity must partner with health home partners to provide health home services as specified in the SPA. A region's PIHP will coordinate enrollment and care with selected providers. Tribal health centers and urban health centers that meet BHH provider qualifications and standards are encouraged to participate and must adhere to the same agreements as mentioned above. The anticipated effective date of this SPA is April 2022.

There is no public hearing scheduled for this SPA. Input regarding this Amendment is highly encouraged, and comments regarding this notice of intent may be submitted to Lorna Elliott-Egan, MDHHS Liaison to the Michigan tribes. Lorna can be reached at 517-512-4146, or via email at Elliott-EganL@michigan.gov. **Please provide all input by December 27, 2021.**

In addition, MDHHS is offering to set up group or individual consultation meetings to discuss the SPA, according to the tribes' preference. Consultation meetings allow tribes the opportunity to address any concerns and voice any suggestions, revisions, or
