I. Call to Order, Introductions – Dr. Joneigh Khaldun

The March 2021 CLEEC Meeting was called to order at 1:01 PM. The roll was taken, and a quorum of members were present.

II. Review and adopt February 2021 CLEEC Minutes – All

Al Vanderberg motioned to approve the February 2021 CLEEC Meeting minutes. Dr. Mona Hanna-Atisha seconded the motion. The minutes were unanimously approved.

III. New Members Introductions

Angela Hood-Beuagard introduced herself to the CLEEC members. Angela will be succeeding Danielle Brown on the CLEEC.

IV. MDHHS COVID-19 Updates – Dr. Joneigh Khaldun

a. Departmental Response – Dr. Joneigh Khaldun

The state continues to advance vaccination efforts and encouraging individuals to not delay vaccines. The state is continuing to watch the data – cases, deaths, and hospitalizations. There is an elevated plateau specific to case numbers but the department remains vigilant.

b. Healthy Homes – Carin Speidel

Have seen a decrease in blood lead testing as a result of testing due to families not being able to attend Well-Child visits. CLPPP has drafted a public health action plan to respond to these needs. The environmental work continues moving forward. COVID-protocols were drafted for critical work. Healthy Homes has launched a workforce incentive program to reward workers doing excellent work around abatement.

A Planning APD has been approved for a replacing the Healthy Housing and Lead Poisoning Surveillance System (HHLPSS).

V. Workgroup Report Out

a. Regulatory

Great discussion with the Medical Services Administration on using CHIP SPA dollars to bring efforts to scale. There are ongoing discussions with the legislature on RRP and Lead Abatement Act changes.

There was a discussion with MIOSHA regarding demolition and delineated the roles and responsibilities. Further conversations will be had with EGLE on who is responsible. HUD partners have also made themselves available to assist with regulatory inquiries.

b. Funding

There were discussions regarding the Lead Prevention Fund, and how MSHDA could be an engage partner with relocation dollars.

VI. CLEEC Strategic Plan Goal #4 Discussion

To create and maintain a consistent centralized database and information technology system for sharing of data and utilization of technology best practices

Tom Largo and Dan Albright shared an overview of current data initiatives within the state health department. Tom Largo described the current dashboard available that is about 90% complete. It includes number of children tested, percent elevated, nursing case management, and lead abatements.

With the lead information registry and expansion, there are limitations on what can be published using the system. To have that tool expanded and providing more information is a goal, but a change to legislation will be needed to expand that.

VII. Other Updates

a. Lead Prevention Fund – James Bell

The Department is still moving forward with the Lead Prevention Fund. The department is drafting an RFP for an administrator who would be responsible for distributing dollars and marketing. There is \$2M in the current budget, and \$10M proposed in the upcoming fiscal year.

b. Teams Site – James Bell

The CLEEC will be migrating SharePoint documents over to Microsoft Teams. Additional instructions will be provided once the migration has occurred.

c. COVID-19 Lead Response Document – James Bell

The CLEEC will be drafting a COVID-19 Lead Response document highlighting impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic on lead activity (testing, abatement, etc.) and opportunities to prepare the public health system as sections of the economy reopens.

d. Dr. Hanna-Atisha reported the 2021 Flint Lead Free report has been released. The link has been shared with the CLEEC Members.

e. Dr. Lyke Thompson, Dr. Rebecca Meuninck and members from the Healthy Homes Coalition of West Michigan have been organizing lead impacted training programs.

f. Eric Oswald provided an update on the Action Level Exceedance (ALE) work. Have been responding in partnership with DHHS. Visit the MiLeadSafe web page for more information.

g. Action Item Recap – James Bell

- i. Determine if there is an opportunity to bring together the CLEEC and the PHAC to discuss COVID-19 response.
- ii. RSVPs will be developed to ensure there is appropriate representation.
