Subject: Dental Periodicity Schedule

Effective: June 1, 2009

Programs Affected: Medicaid

Under federal regulations, the Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic and Treatment (EPSDT) service requires state Medicaid programs to provide dental services at intervals that meet reasonable standards of dental practice to eligible Medicaid beneficiaries less than 21 years of age.

In accordance with this regulation, a separate periodicity schedule for the delivery of dental services by dentists has been developed. This schedule is included both in the EPSDT Section of the Practitioner Chapter and in the Dental Chapter of the Medicaid Provider Manual.

The dental periodicity schedule is as follows:

## FOR DENTISTS: An examination is recommended by age one. An examination by a dentist is required by age three. It is then recommended that dental visits be repeated every six months.
