Funding: \$1,648,188 per year (total anticipated funding \$8,240,940)

Overarching Goal: To utilize environmental change, community and individual level interventions to build healthier communities and increase behavioral health capacity to address underage drinking and prescription drug misuse and abuse among youth and young adults through consistent screening in primary care settings.

Overview:

The PFS project will strengthen and expand the [Strategic Prevention Framework five-step, data-driven process](#) to enhance community-level infrastructure to link with primary care, which in turn will help to foster change in targeted communities that are underserved, and in high need of evidence-based programs to address underage drinking among persons age 12-20 and prescription drug misuse and abuse among persons age 12-25. Counties that meet this high need and are underserved include Muskegon, Mason, Oceana, St. Joseph, Bay, Wayne, Macomb, and Genesee.
