OK, well, it looks like a number of things are moving forward. First is that there will likely be a large press conference with Nick, Wyant, Gov's rep, Mayor and LHD reps on Thursday or Friday. The assignments per Nick have been meted out to MDEQ or MDHHS as appropriate.

- Corinne leads the EHS tox and Lead Epi teams who are looking at the Hurley and VT data, as well as re-analyzing all of the data we have on a zipcode basis. Major concern for Geralyn et al is that we can still state that there is a seasonal affect, which I have reassured them there is; the question is whether the increases in BLL are truly increases after the change in water source. We hope to get some answers within the next day---high urgency due to risk communication issues.
- Rashmi is working to see if there is any way to get formula to the Flint area and who would cover (USDA still not being definitive).
- I am working to get a UMSPH rep to sit on the Mayor's Technical Advisory group in Flint per Dan Wyant's request.

That is it for now- Nick very much wants to get any input if any action is identified that needs his response on behalf of MDHHS.
