



# Creating Maps Michigan Environmental Public Health Tracking

#### Creating Maps

Welcome to the Michigan Environmental Public Health Tracking, or MiTracking, tutorial on Creating Maps.

Maps are one of the useful ways to view query results. This tutorial will show you how to create them.

Let's get started!



#### Running a query

#### We'll find the data portal at michigan.gov/mitracking.

#### To enter the data portal, click on the blue Go to the Data button.

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## Starting a Query

From the data portal main page I need to select a **Category**, **Content Area**, **Indicator**, and **Measure**.

These selections are "dynamic," meaning the options will change based on what you've chosen in the previous drop-down.

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## Selecting Data

For this example, I'll start by selecting Health, Asthma, Hospitalizations, and Age-Adjusted Rate of Hospitalization for Asthma.

After I have made these four selections, more options will appear. The selections I make for **Geography** & Time Periods and Other Filters will determine whether my results can be mapped.



### Geographic Areas

For this measure, I can choose either State and/or County or Local Health Departments for my Geographic Level, so I'll choose State and/or County.

To produce a map, I must select one, some, or all **Counties** as my geographic area. I want to know the age-adjusted rate of asthma hospitalizations for all the counties in Michigan, so I will choose **Select All**.



## Statewide Only

For the **Geographic Area** selection, I may see the option to select **Statewide Only**.

**Statewide Only** will give me one result for the State of Michigan. I may want to include this option to compare individual county rates to the State of Michigan total rate.

For some measures, data may only be available at the state level.



## Statewide Only

If I make **Statewide Only** my only selection for **Geographic Area**, my query results will produce a table and chart, but not a map. Instead, the map tab will result in an error message.

If I'm unsure about which selections will produce a map, I can hover over the help icon to remind me.



#### Time Periods

Only ONE selection for time period can be mapped for each query. Depending on the measure, the time period could be **5-year aggregates**, **single-years**, or **quarters**.

For this query, **single-years** are available and I'll select the year **2013**.



#### Other Filters

Only ONE selection for each of the **Other Filters** can be mapped per query.

**Gender** is the only **Other Filter** available for this measure, but other measures may have additional filters.

I can select **All Genders**, or I could select just **Females**, or just **Males**. I will select **All Genders**.



#### Results

After clicking the **Run Query** button, I'm ready to see my results! To view the map, I will select the **Map** tab.

I can interact with my map by using the zoom buttons in the top left corner of the map, or by clicking on a county to see the specific rate.

Results for some counties may be too small to provide based on reliability and confidentiality. The data for these counties are suppressed and are shown in hashmarks.



<sup>\*\*</sup> Indicates suppressed dat

Staff have adhered to the cell suppression rules by suppressing all counts and rates greater than 0 and less than 6. Complimentary suppression has also been completed to prevent any back calculation of suppressed cells.

#### Results

I can also download the data or save my map as a picture using the **Download Data** and **Save Map** buttons.



## Saving the Query

I can save my results by opening the **Data Options** dropdown, clicking on the **Save Query** button, and copying the link. This is a convenient way to share or save my query.

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#### That's it!

I just created a map on the MiTracking portal. Now I can include it in my next presentation. I can also find more information about asthma on the <u>MiTracking website</u>.
