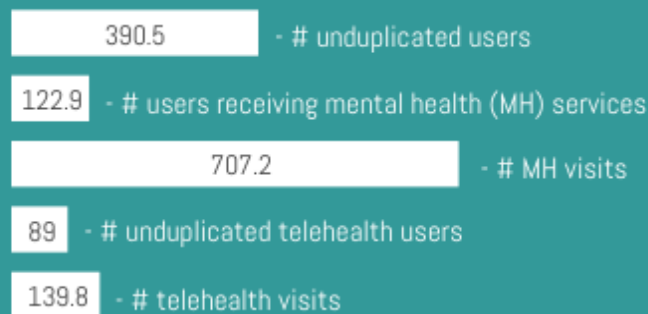


# School Wellness Program FY2017 SNAPSHOT

## SWP Users & Visits

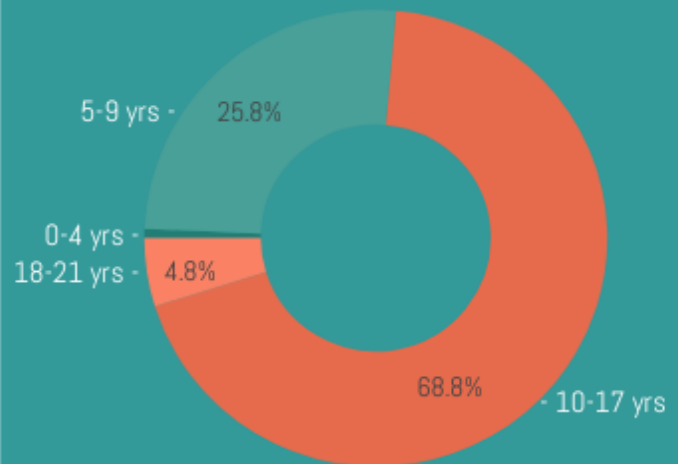
The below bars show the average number of SWP users by category in FY2017 (October, 2016 through September, 2017).



In FY2017, SWP sites reached a total of 5,858 unduplicated users, with 1,843 of those clients receiving MH services, and 10,608 total MH visits.

## Who Uses the SWP?

SWP users are close to evenly split among females (51.6%) and males (48.4%). The majority of SWP clients identify as White (67.3%) and Black/African American (25.7%). Most users are 10-17 years of age, followed by 5-9 years (see chart below for percent of users by age category).



## Chronic Disease Case Management Plan

Ensuring that clients with chronic care conditions have case management plans in place is vitally important in caring for students while in school. It is also a useful tool to assist SWP staff in teaching clients how to live well with their conditions. Overall, 9 in 10 SWP clients with chronic disease conditions have a case management plan.



# Additional Services Provided by SWPs

Here is a quick view of the types of specialty services being provided. Percentages below reflect responses from a total of 15 SWP year-end reports.

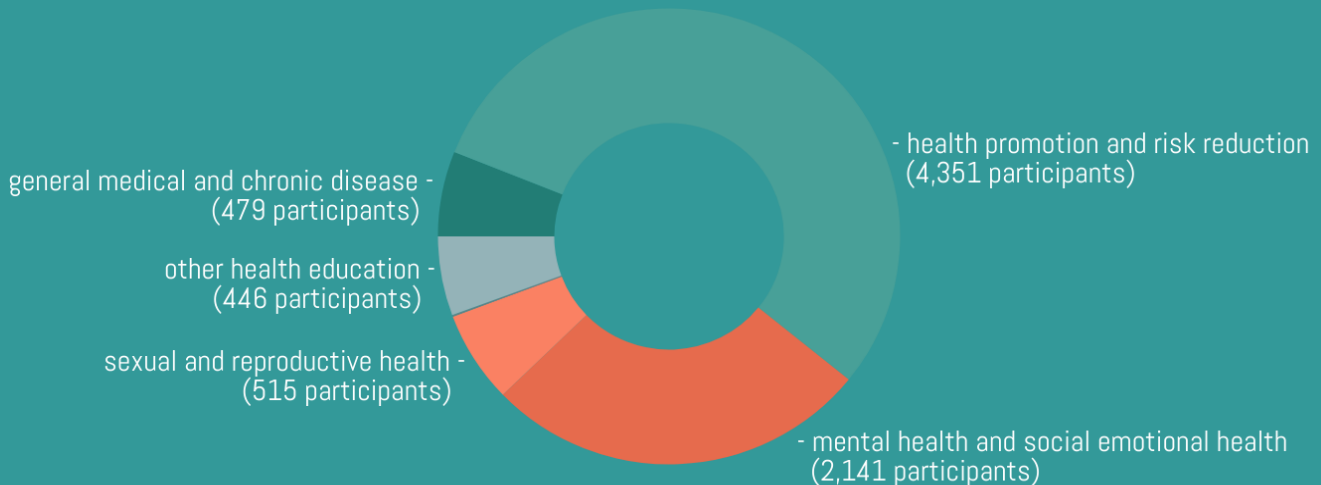

## Health Education

SWP staff provide health education in a group or classroom setting in various focus areas. This is a great way for staff to build relationships with teachers, administrators, and students in the school, to promote the services the SWP provides and to increase clientele. In FY2017, SWP sites reached 7,942 participants (average of 530 individuals per site) with group health education sessions.



## Medicaid Outreach

In FY2017, more than 50,000 materials containing information about the Medicaid program were distributed by SWP sites. Outreach activities include informing eligible or potentially eligible individuals about Medicaid and how to access Medicaid services and describing the services covered under a Medicaid program as part of a broader presentation.
