

MiTracking gathers existing Michigan environmental, health and population data. This data are available in one online location through the MiTracking Data Portal. The website hosts information and resources about each data topic.

The Data Portal makes it easy to find data at the state, county and sometimes local levels. Data are displayed in tables, charts and maps. You can download, save and print these data visualizations.

Everyone, from community members to public health professionals to students, can easily run MiTracking data searches. With these tools, MiTracking can help all Michiganders explore how the environment may impact health.

Michigan is part of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) National Environmental Public Health Tracking Program. The CDC Tracking Program is a system of integrated health, exposure and hazard data from national, state and local sources.


