MiTracking makes data on Michigan-specific environmental hazards, human exposure to these hazards, and health effects easier to find and use. With MiTracking, we can better understand and explore how the environment may impact human health.

Everyone, from citizens to public health professionals to students, can easily run data queries on the MiTracking data portal. Data query results are provided in tables, charts, and maps that can be downloaded, saved, and printed.
