Effective 3/24/20, Governor Whitmer's Executive Order 2020-21 temporarily suspends activities that are not required to sustain or protect life. This means in-person parenting time and sibling visits at residential facilities may not occur unless a court order requires it and it can be safely facilitated based on required screening outlined in Executive Order 2020-7. This restriction will be in place until 4/13/20; MDHHS will revisit this restriction at that time and will resume in-person family contact as soon as possible.

Please know that we did not make this determination lightly. We understand how critically important it is for you to maintain contact with your child, especially during this difficult time. When in-person visits cannot occur, facility staff will work with you to arrange phone calls and utilize technology, such as Skype, FaceTime, or Zoom, to allow as much contact with your child as possible.

Your child's health, well-being, and treatment remain our top priority.
