GRANTS

- **Continuation Application for State Opioid Response Two (SOR2) Grant** – Year two application has been submitted.
- **Center for Substance Abuse Treatment (CSAT)** – Application submitted that addresses pregnant and parenting and women (PPW) living with opioid use disorders to provide specialized treatment services. We are Targeting Opioid Health Homes at *Northern Michigan Regional Entity - Region Two* and *Detroit Wayne Integrated Health Network - Region Seven*. Includes obstetrics (OB) and pediatric providers in the opioid health homes network. Evidence Based Practices (EBP) for family development skills and paternity for fathers, among others. This grant is for \$900,000.00 per year for three years and is very competitive; only four nationwide.
- **Center for Substance Abuse Prevention (CSAP)** – The *FY 2021 Grant to Prevent Prescription Drug/Opioid Overdose-Related Deaths (PDO)* application is being prepared. The purpose of the grant is to reduce the number of prescription drug/opioid overdose-related deaths and adverse events among individuals 18 years of age and older. This grant is \$850,000.00 for five years; Partnering with Prevention Network to manage a mini-grant program in Calhoun, Genesee, and Wayne counties to offer opioid education and naloxone distribution. In addition, working with Michigan State University (MSU) Extension with another region on education in the medical community. MSU will also evaluate the grant. Thirteen grants exist. This grant is due March 1, 2021. Competitiveness includes states in all United States.
- **State Opioid Response (SOR) 1 Year 2 Annual Report** - Complete and will send to Su Min to share with everyone.
- **State Targeted Response (STR) Final Evaluation Plan** - is currently being reviewed by Communications. Will send this to everyone after approval.

Emerging Issues and Trends

Drug overdose deaths PowerPoint presentation by Su Min Oh. The 2019 Death file is now finalized. Everyone viewed the 2018/2019 data by specific opioid groups. Of significance, a reduction has taken place by nine percent for drug overdose deaths opioid involved deaths reduced by 13 percent and heroin and prescription opioids has continued over 20 percent, as well as other data related to this presentation. Partner Updates

- **Office of Highway Safety Planning (OHSP)** – *Christy Sanborn*
Still working from home. Traffic Safety Summit is cancelled. Looking into offering training and information sharing in the coming months; will keep everyone informed. Releasing a new marijuana and driving campaign; video, billboard, and radio ads end of June beginning of July. Working on next fiscal year's 2022 plan.
- **Bureau of Epidemiology and Population Health/Division of Communicable Disease/HAI, Infectious Diseases Update** – *Brandon Hool/ Joe Coyle/Seth Eckel/Mary Miller*
Virtual Harm Reduction Summit – Takes place the month of August. Working with OROSC on an engagement center project for the syringe service programs (SSP) working on identifying partners . Also working with Detroit Recovery Project to engage people who are drug users in communities or substance use disorder (SUD) or services; including SSP and engaging with communities of color; disparities in negative health outcomes increase and engaging more. Syringe utilization data collection platform is being used by SSP using as their primary data collection system. As the data set grows and becomes more robust more analysis will take place. Looking at racial disparities and other disparities to improve services. Will also be creating report cards for programs to evaluate and improve their services and producing more comprehensive service improvement.
- **Combined Effort - Bureau of Epidemiology and Population Health/Division of Environmental Health/Environmental Surveillance Section and Bureau of Health and Wellness/Division of Chronic Disease and Injury Control/Injury and Violence Prevention Section, Michigan Overdose: Data to Action (MODA)** – *Group, Rita Seith, Tom Largo, Sarah Rockhill, and Gabrielle Stroh-Steiner, Nina Bowser, Jan Fields, Alicia Goodman*
- **MODA Planning** - Meeting taking place on March 4, for the next grant year with grantees and contractors.
Survey – Stephanie Larocco has left and her position and on March 22 a new person will start. Gabriel Stroh-Steiner will be out on new baby maternity leave for the next few months.
