


## Increasing Avg. Percent Positivity

Percent positivity is up 14% since last week


#### Increasing Cases Per Million

### Decreasing Avg. Hospitalization




1.3% beds for COVID-19, 11week decline

Percent of inpatient beds occupied by individuals with COVID-19 down 9% since last week







## Delta Variant and What to Expect Next



• Delta (B.1.617.2) is highly transmissible.

- Internationally, many countries are experiencing another surge in cases, including countries that previously had been able to mitigate spread.
- Given the low population vaccination coverage throughout the United States, another surge is inevitable.
- Multicomponent prevention strategies, including continued vaccinations, remain important to reduce spread now and this Fall/Winter.

# Update to CDC Guidelines: K-12 Schools and Early Childhood Programs

Safely returning to in-person instruction = priority Vaccination = the leading public health prevention strategy

- Masks should be worn indoors by individuals (age 2 and older) who are not fully vaccinated.
- Schools recommended to maintain at least 3 feet of physical distance between students in classrooms, combined with indoor mask wearing.
- Many schools serve children under the age of 12. When not possible to maintain physical distance, it is especially important to layer multiple other prevention strategies including:
  - Screening and testing
  - Ensuring proper ventilation
  - Engaging in handwashing and respiratory etiquette
  - Staying home when sick
  - Contact tracing with quarantine and isolation
  - Cleaning and disinfecting
- COVID-19 **prevention strategies remain critical**, especially in areas of moderate-to-high community transmission levels.
- Localities should monitor community transmission, vaccination coverage, screening testing, and occurrence of outbreaks to guide decisions on the level of layered prevention strategies.


