Work Plan Objective Progress and Highlights:

Injury Prevention

Objective: The RTN is active in the monitoring and evaluation of Injury Prevention activities and programs.

Progress: The injury prevention committee continues to meet quarterly via MS Teams. The focus has been on handgun violence/suicide attempt. Due to Covid, there has been very limited opportunity for face-to-face activities. The regional Injury Prevention Coordinators continue to seek virtual courses that can be shared throughout the region.

Communications

Objective: During the 2020-2023 application period, the RTN will continue to monitor regional EMS communication procedures for major EMS (mass casualty) events that are multijurisdictional and coordinated with the incident management system.

Progress: During the last quarter, the region has secured grant money that will allow for a new communication platform between EMS and hospitals. General Devices "eBridge" has been purchased, there have been two conference calls with GD giving an initial overview for each MCA and a virtual overview/Q & A meeting is scheduled for Macomb and St. Clair Co. MCA leadership and their stakeholders. Implementation throughout the region is tentatively scheduled for July 1, 2021

Infrastructure

Objective: By December 31, 2023, the RTN, with the assistance of the RPSRO, will develop a system to collect data that will allow for the monitoring of interfacility transfers.

Progress: With the use of Biospatial, analytical reports are available that will give a snapshot into the decision making by EMS, the hospital capability, and why the destination was chosen. This will also allow tracking of patients that were taken to a lower-level trauma center and later transferred to a higher-level trauma center.

Regional Performance Improvement

Objective: During the 2020-2023 application period, the RPSRO in collaboration with the RTN and RTAC, will continue to develop additional methodologies to evaluate and improve system performance.

Progress: Analytical reports through Biospatial are beginning to allow assessment and evaluation of the field triage/destination protocol as required by the administrative rules. The RPSRO will be presented with these reports as they become available. In addition, the RPSRO inventory data will be

discussed to identify any gaps in the region.

Continuum of Care

Objective: By December 31, 2020, the RTN, with participation of the RTAC will identify regional rehabilitation resources through the completion of the RPSRO Inventory.

Progress: Due to Covid, this objective will be extended through December 31, 2022

Trauma Education

Objective: During the 2020-2023 application period, the RTN will monitor the process utilized by the medical control authority's (MCA's) and/or R2N Education Committee, to educate all personnel on new protocols, treatment plans, and procedures while assuring compliance.

Progress: The implementation of TXA will begin for regions 2N and 2S starting June 1, 2021. Protocol and education will be provided via the MCA's. Tracking the use of TXA will be done collaboratively through the RTN RPSRO and MCA's PSRO committees over a 1 year timeframe.

Other relevant activities information:

Huron Valley Sinai hospital will participate in a pilot virtual verification and designation visit. This visit is tentatively being scheduled for mid to late summer in hopes of being completed and available for review by the designation committee at the September meeting.
