Work Plan Objective Progress and Highlights:

Injury Prevention

Objective: A trauma system public information and education plan exists that heightens public awareness of trauma as a disease, the need for a trauma care system and the prevention of injury. The RTN will promote evidenced based primary injury prevention activities and projects.

Progress: The Region 1 RMCAN working with the Trauma Network secured a grant to supply all regional transporting agencies and hospitals with Carter Kits. These kits are designed to help interact with kids who have autism spectrum disorders during an emergency. Along with the kits, the recipients will receive education on caring for kids with ASD's.

Communications

Objective: There are established procedures for EMS and trauma system communications for major EMS events or multiple jurisdiction incidents that are effectively coordinated with the overall regional response plans.

Progress: The Region 1 RTC and trauma partners participated in the D1 HCC Pediatric exercise regarding the pediatric coordinating care center. This CHECC supported center will help to move kids to pediatric care centers during a MCI event.

Infrastructure

Objective: There is a clearly defined, cooperative, and ongoing relationship between regional trauma physician leaders and the EMS system medical directors in the region.

Progress: There has been a focus on integration of EMS education, data and participation in the trauma network. Several EMS agencies and Fire Services received grant funds to augment trauma education (ITLS) and patient care equipment regarding the care of the trauma patient.

Regional Performance Improvement

Objective: The retrospective medical oversight of the EMS system for trauma triage, communications, treatment, and transport is closely coordinated with the established performance improvement processes of the trauma system.

Progress: The RPSRO is working on how to use the data inventory for performance improvement

Continuum of Care

Objective: The lead agency has incorporated, within the trauma system plan and the trauma center standards, requirements for rehabilitation services including interfacility transfer of trauma patients to rehabilitation centers.

Progress: Not much work has been done with this pillar.

Trauma Education

Objective: The regional trauma network establishes and ensures that appropriate levels of EMS, nursing and physician trauma training courses are provided on a regular basis.

Progress: Work continues on developing an educational series for EMS partners regarding trauma care and critical care needs during interfacility transports.
