Assessing and Managing Suicide Risk (AMSR) Training

AMSR's research-informed risk formulation model helps health and behavioral health professionals feel confident navigating challenging conversations and offers key strategies for providing compassionate care to people at risk for suicide. Authorized expert trainers lead AMSR trainings, teaching professionals essential skills through videos, live demonstrations, and paired and written practice.

AMSR has been working since 2006 to train clinicians on how to provide effective treatment for patients and clients who are at risk of suicide. Over 70,000 mental health professionals have attended AMSR workshops in the United States and abroad.

Host from Community Sponsoring Agency is not required to be in attendance for the full training but should be there to assist in set up at the facility and available throughout the day.

Community Sponsoring Agency is responsible for participant recruitment to include a focus on caregivers for the youth/young adult population.
