#### Vaccine Administration Reimbursement Increase State Plan Amendment Request

The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) plans to submit a State Plan Amendment (SPA) request to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) to increase reimbursement for the administration of vaccines to beneficiaries 18 years and younger.

The anticipated effective date for the Vaccine Administration Reimbursement Increase SPA is October 1, 2024.

Effective October 1, 2024, vaccine administration rates will be increased to \$23.03 for beneficiaries 18 years and younger.

This change does not apply to vaccine administration codes for COVID-19. COVID-19 administration codes will continue to be reimbursed up to 100 percent of Medicare reimbursement rates.

The estimated gross cost to the State of Michigan for the SPA is \$8.47 million per year.

There is no public meeting scheduled regarding this notice. **RE:** Reimbursement for Vaccine Administration

This letter, in compliance with Section 1902(a)(73) and Section 2107(e)(1)(C) of the Social Security Act, serves as notice to all Tribal Chairs and Health Directors of the intent by the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) to submit a State Plan Amendment (SPA) request to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS).

The purpose of this SPA is to support statewide efforts at improving vaccine access. This SPA increases the reimbursement for vaccine administration to \$23.03 for beneficiaries 18 years of age and younger. MDHHS anticipates there will be minimal impact on Native American beneficiaries. The anticipated effective date of this SPA is October 1, 2024.

There is no public hearing scheduled for this SPA. Due to the requirements within Public Act 121 of 2024, effective October 1, 2024, it is not possible to adhere to the sixty (60) days notification. Therefore, notification is being provided as soon as possible. Input regarding this SPA is highly encouraged, and comments regarding this notice of intent may be submitted to Lorna Elliott-Egan, MDHHS Liaison to the Michigan tribes. In addition, MDHHS is offering to set up group or individual consultation meetings to discuss the SPA, according to the tribes' preference. Consultation meetings allow tribes the opportunity to address any concerns and voice any suggestions, revisions, or objections to be relayed to the author of the proposal.
