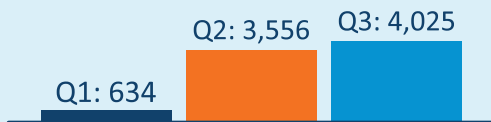


Local health partners are increasing housing stability across Michigan. Communities are using SDOH screenings to help households experiencing housing insecurity. Families are receiving case management services that prevent evictions, divert from shelters, and find temporary housing solutions. Regions are supporting medical respite care and protecting tenant rights to meet diverse housing needs.

Number of Eligible Households Served



Community Health Workers (CHW) work to address housing disparities among impacted families. They help families navigate resources, fill service gaps, and support community engagement, playing a vital role as housing navigators.

Local health partners and CHWs spent 1916 hours on community engagement.

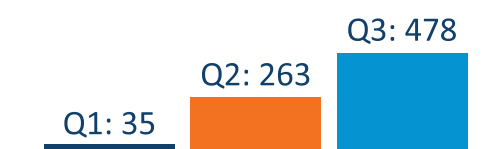
Communities are improving CIE efforts by assessing readiness, enhancing data exchange, and sharing resources. To support CIE, local health partners are working with a variety of stakeholders to implement:

- Closed-loop referral platform
- Universal Referral Form
- SDOH Standardized Screening Tool
- Community Resource Portals
- Mobile App
- Housing Control Center
- 60 – Day CIE Pilot



Cross-sector partnerships are important for improving housing stability. Local health partners have hosted educational and listening sessions to better understand needs and promote housing resources. By building trusted relationships, communities are growing resource use and promoting equitable outcomes.
