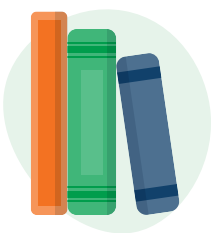


The Good Housing = Good Health program empowers Communities through housing support by providing:



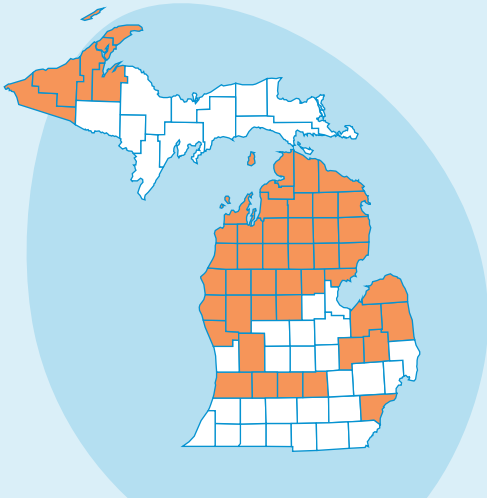

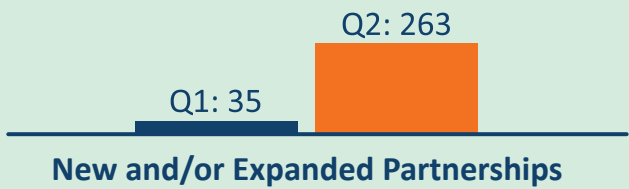
Community health workers help with housing by serving as:

- **Housing Navigators:** Help you find and connect with housing resources.
- **Information Sharers:** Provide important information to help communities stay informed about housing options.
- **Problem Solvers:** Identify and address issues that can lead to housing instability.

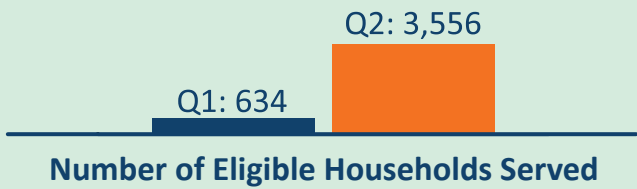
From January to March 2024, local health partners worked with community health workers who dedicated **1,461 hours** to community outreach, helping families in their community's access resources to meet basic needs and achieve stable housing.



Communities are working together to share resources and address housing needs. By partnering with local organizations and hospitals, we provided housing referrals and assistance to households in need.



Local health partners have made significant progress in service delivery and community support, serving over 3500 eligible households from January – March 2024.



Through the Good Housing = Good Health program, local health partners are actively engaging in the Community Information Exchange (CIE) to help connect community residents to resources through enhanced data exchange.
