EQI Update (10 minutes)	Crystal Williams	EQI workgroup continues to meet. Made changes to frequency of updates. Keeping period 2 and 3 similar. Trying to minimize changes in mid-year. Just finished FY23 period 3. FY 24 Period 1 due June.
H2011 and H2011 HT Future Changes (10 Minutes)	Krista Hausermann	We are looking at current staffing qualifications for H2011 and H2011 HT. Intend to submit some draft language to this group over the next couple of months. Looking at a skills-based approach rather than a degree-based approach.
Transition from Wraparound to Intensive Care Coordination with Wraparound (10 minutes)	Phil Kurdunowicz	<p>The current Wraparound planning process is transitioning to ICCW, effective October 1, 2024. Wraparound (H2022) will be removed from the SEDW Service Array, effective October 1, 2024. ICCW will be available as a state plan service.</p> <p>The Department is seeking feedback on using the H2021 or using T1017 with a modifier as the H2022 will no longer be available.</p> <p>Jeff – wants to check with others and will e-mail comments.</p>

Code Chart and Provider Qualifications Chart Updates (10 minutes)	Kasi	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Same-time Services Reporting tab included a note regarding Certified Peer Support Specialists attending medical appointments. This has caused some confusion; no encounters should be reported for the Peer attending medical appointments. This would instead be tracked internally and is considered an indirect cost. • V1-V4 Modifiers. These are the new inpatient tiered rate modifiers that are now available, and we would like them implemented starting Q4. This is for the revenue code 0100 only. The Department has put together a Fact Sheet and we will distribute this soon. • Added two new codes 97550 and 97551 for OT and PT effective 4/1/24. • Added new Place of Service code 27. <p>See update log for other changes.</p>
New Codes Feedback (5 minutes)	Kasi & Group	<p>We only received feedback from three group members. We are going to delay this until the July 18, 2024, meeting. Please feel free to send feedback if your agency has any regarding these codes.</p> <p>Ed – are these codes going to be under the CCBHC benefit too? Kasi will check with CCBHC team.</p> <p>Group can send feedback on codes to Kasi (HunzigerK@michigan.gov), and I will compile a list and send to group for review prior to our July meeting.</p>
U Modifiers Update (5 minutes)	Kasi & Group	<p>Updated January minutes and e-mail sent on February 28, 2024, from Julie Harrison. The U modifiers should be counting all participants in the group and not just the open/active CMH beneficiaries.</p>

<p>Substance Use Disorder Group Sizes</p>	<p>Trisha Thrush (Mid-State)</p>	<p>Will share document with group after the meeting.</p> <p>To allow for all participants in a group to have their voices heard and to have an opportunity to practice communication and life skills, group size is usually capped at 15, though per SAMHSA TIP #41, an ideal range is 8-10 participants, i.e., “small enough for members to practice the skills being taught.”</p> <p>The recommendation is either to include information in the Reporting and Costing Considerations column or to create a separate tab in the Behavioral Health Code Charts and Provider Qualifications beginning 10.01.2024. The intent is to provide a source to clarify group sizes for SUD services.</p> <p>For SUD codes 90853, H0005, H0010, H0012, H0018, H0019, H2027, H2035, and H2036, include the following language:</p> <p>Therapeutic/Interpersonal (Core) Group Size: A size limit of 8-10 participants (15 at most) for core/therapeutic/interpersonal process groups, consistent with SAMHSA guidance.</p> <p>Psychoeducation/Didactic (Core) Group Size: Skills-building groups that hinge on participant engagement, sharing, and/or practice of skills. Group size should be limited to 20 to allow participants capacity to engage, interact, and practice individualized skills.</p> <p>Evidence-based Therapy (Core) Group Size: Group therapy with a particular curriculum, group structure and/or target population should follow the parameters of that program to fidelity, including group size recommendations. If the EBP does not have a specific group size parameter, then the provider will utilize the guidance for Therapeutic/Interpersonal (Core) group size of 8-10 participants (15 at most).</p> <p>Lecture (non-Core) Group Size: Educational groups that are not contingent on participant engagement, sharing and/or practice of skills presented in a lecture format. Group size should accommodate the needs of individuals served. Lectures do not count towards “core/life skills”</p>
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		<p>treatment services unless the lectures are not more than 20 individuals or there is a breakout time for smaller groups to process the lecture of no more than 20 individuals per each facilitator.</p> <p>For SUD codes H0038 and T1012, include the following language:</p> <p>Lecture (non-Core) Group Size: Educational groups that are not contingent on participant engagement, sharing and/or practice of skills presented in a lecture format. Group size should accommodate the needs of individuals served. Lectures do not count towards “core/life skills” treatment services unless the lectures are not more than 20 individuals or there is a breakout time for smaller groups to process the lecture of no more than 20 individuals per facilitator.</p> <p>Group will take this document back and review.</p>
