Review and approve prior meeting minutes (5 minutes)	Vincenza	N/A
Inpatient Tiered Rates (5-10 minutes)	Crystal Williams	<p>The department would like to get more accurate reporting of inpatient tiered rates moving forward. The department is hoping to find a minimally invasive way to reporting that would start the 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter of FY25.</p> <p>A subgroup will be started to go over this issue more in-depth, Crystal will reach out the previous group for feedback to start the new group.</p>
EQI Update (10 Minutes)	Crystal Williams	EQI period 2 was sent in recently, and this will be given back as soon as possible. The department is working with Milliman to get answers to questions and template changes for next time.
Transportation Codes	Belinda, Jackie, Lyndia, and Kasi	<p>The department is looking into breaking out transportation codes from those that have them embedded in some services currently. There are inconsistencies in what is being used and we would like to clarify. Each CMHSP seems to be billing these differently. The Medicaid provider manual needs to be updated to clarify if transportation should be embedded in CLS or Skill building services moving forward.</p> <p>The department would like to get an idea of how the CMHSPs are utilizing these services currently and how these should be coded in the long run.</p> <p>Some agencies report that admin overhead pays for the transportation as needed. There are unfunded transportation needs when no agency is involved, this is often seen in self-determination services.</p> <p>The department would like to bring back a subgroup to discuss this topic.</p>

<p>CLS and OHSS Per Diem Discussions</p>	<p>Belinda &amp; Audra</p>	<p>Department is considering/researching what it would take to bring back per diem code for non-licensed residential CLS, have had preliminary conversations to bring in front of this group for comment.</p> <p>The current proposed CLS code changes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- H2015- 15 min code up to 9 hr 59 min</li> <li>- H0043- 10 hours-15 hours and 59 minutes</li> <li>- H0043- 16+ hours with a TG modifier</li> </ul> <p>When the proposed changes are implemented (hoping for January 1<sup>st</sup>), there will be a rolling transition until October 2025.</p> <p>In addition to CLS, OHSS has proposed changes as well.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- T2026 (per diem code) for more than 6 hours per day</li> <li>- T2027 stays for less than 6 hours per day</li> </ul> <p>These would also fall under the same rolling transition. For those outside of the waivers, utilize H2015 with a UJ modifier. There is a possibility non-waiver could use T2026, but this will be taken back to consider, along with EVV considerations</p> <p>Please reach out with any considerations you would like to share to mdhhs-providerqualificationcode@michigan.gov.</p>
<p>ICCW Update</p>	<p>Phil, Tammy, and Alyssa</p>	<p>This is a new service that was approved by CMS, effective October 1. You may be familiar with wraparound in waiver and out of waiver. This new structure maintains wraparound principles, but blends case management with it. Other states have already adopted this model.</p> <p>The new waiver application has not been approved; therefore, H2022 should be utilized as the per diem code on the waivers. H2021 should be utilized off of the waivers. Hopefully, H2021 will be used for both in the future. The language in the waiver has a case management component.</p> <p>The department would like to give a grace period for current providers to adapt. We are working on new ICCW care coordinator credentialing.</p>

		<p>For those who are new that have never been trained in wraparound before, they will fill out the form with their supervisor and submit it to Tammy to review. They will work on an abbreviated training, 1 day or 2 half days in December. Once the ICCW curriculum is developed current and new providers will attend new training, hopefully this spring.</p> <p>A form was sent out with a link to verify who has completed training and is certified as a facilitator/coordinator. Those signing up will be asked whether or not they have completed person-centered planning (PCP) and when it was completed.</p>
Children's EBP Update	Mary Ludtke	<p>The department is working to utilize modifiers for Children's EBPs. A list was shared with the group for reference of current EBPs and their modifiers. Several of the EBPs so not have modifiers currently, but they have been requested. The department is hoping to track utilization of these and who is part of the collaborative. This should be completed in the next few months.</p> <p>Some individuals have reported that they are having difficulty accessing these modifiers in their EMR. Anything that can be done to improve access to utilize these from the group would be appreciated</p>
H0031-6Y	Kasi & Mary Luchies	<p>The department received a number of concerns about no longer allowing master's level counselors for this service. A Functional Behavioral Assessment (FBA) is not typically in the scope of practice for a social worker or LPC. They can be a part of planning, but FBAs are more structured. An FBA would be most appropriately used for IDD or individuals in adult foster care homes to address changes in behavior.</p> <p>Mary is willing to consult on cases regarding this and will be presenting at upcoming conferences on behavior treatment plans vs. behavior support</p> <p>There are other assessment codes that an LPC and Social worker can complete, look under the crosswalk. 96112 &amp; 96113 are suggested</p>

		<p>alternatives that would be appropriate for social workers and LPCs to complete</p> <p>The concern prior to this change was the scope of practice for this service vs. what is actually being done. We would like appropriate use of this code.</p> <p>Can bill with H2015 if an LBA is conducting a behavioral assessment (97151) while the individual is receiving CLS supports from another provider.</p>
Self-Determination (U7) Modifier	Laura D. and Lyndia	The department is seeing less utilization of this modifier. This should capture all of the models of self-direction; including, purchase of services agreement, agency with choice and Fiscal Intermediary (FI). We are asking the group to go back and check what is currently being done in each region and if this modifier is falling off in the process. The code chart reflects all services that should utilize this modifier.
Partial Hospitalization	Pam Flory/ Sue Panetta	There has been some push back from hospitals around PHP requirements from Medicaid because it does not align with other requirements (example: Medicare). There will potentially be an update in the Medicaid provider manual regarding this and it is being taken back and looked at, at this time.

Some changes included:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Added A0428 service code (GF only)</li> <li>• Modified 97151 as it is no longer allowed for non-ABA.</li> <li>• Added row for H0031-6Y for Behavior Identification Assessment (BPT) for non-ABA customers.</li> <li>• Modified Autism Services providers for the following codes: 0362T, 0373T, 97151, 97153, 97155, 97156, 97157, and 97158.</li> <li>• Added HS modifier to 97156.</li> <li>• Added U (group) modifiers to the following codes: 97150 and 92508.</li> <li>• Modified LOCUS Assessment to be LOCUS Screening throughout chart.</li> <li>• S5111-WP - the "Trained Parent" has moved to its own line as it is now a State Plan</li> </ul>
