PROGRAM MISSION AND PURPOSE

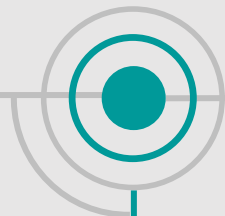
WHY WE ARE HERE...

- Breast and cervical cancers affect thousands of women each year across the US
- The greatest impact is on those with limited access to care
- Screening reduces mortality rates and improves cancer patients' survival
- Racial and ethnic minorities and uninsured and underinsured women have disproportionately low rates of screening

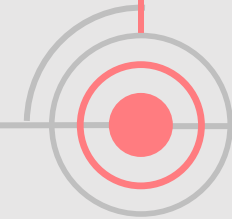
NBCCEDP DEVELOPMENT



National Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program administered by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to provide screening, and later, diagnostic services to low-income, uninsured and underinsured women



Breast and Cervical Cancer Mortality Prevention Act to improve access to breast and cervical screening

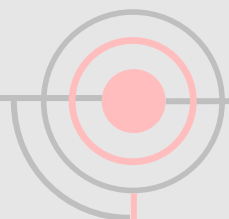


NBCCEDP DEVELOPMENT



Native American Breast and Cervical Cancer Treatment Technical Amendment Act to stating the MTA applies to American Indian and Alaska Native women who are eligible for health services provided by the Indian Health Service or a tribal organization

Breast and Cervical Cancer Prevention and Treatment Act (MTA) to allow states to offer those who are diagnosed with cancer in the NBCCEDP access to treatment through Medicaid

THE NBCCEDP'S REACH

The NBCCEDP funds award recipients in:

- All 50 states
- The District of Columbia
- 2 U.S. territories
- 5 U.S.-affiliated Pacific Islands and
- 13 American Indian and Alaska Native tribes or tribal organizations

THE NBCCEDP'S REACH

NBCCEDP-funded programs have

- Served over **6.1 million** clients
- Provided over **15.7 million** breast and cervical cancer screening examinations
- During 2016-2017, **about 5.3%** of U.S. women were eligible and **15% of those eligible** were served
- In Program Year 2021, the NBCCEDP
 - Served **253,972** women
 - Diagnosed **2,494** invasive cancers
 - Diagnosed **6,832** premalignant lesions

GOAL:

Help low-income, uninsured and underinsured women gain access to timely breast and cervical cancer screening, diagnostic and treatment services.

EVIDENCE-BASED INTERVENTIONS (EBI) PROJECT



GOAL:

Implement evidence-based interventions (EBIs) to increase and improve the quality of breast and cervical cancer screening in health systems and primary care clinics serving priority populations.

SUMMARY



PURPOSE: Decrease cancer incidence, morbidity and mortality by increasing access to breast and cervical cancer screening, diagnostic and treatment services in underserved populations with increased cancer risk due to health inequities.
