- 1 The inflatable colon exhibit requires approximately 10 feet by 10 feet of floor space and takes approximately 30 minutes to set up and break down.
- 2 For indoor events, a 15-foot ceiling height is necessary.
- 3 The Inflatable Colon is wheelchair, stroller and motorized scooter accessible.
