Are you putting off important screenings or worrying about the cost of care? With the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services, it's easy to improve your health and get free medical help.

Discover two programs available to Michiganders.

BC3NP

The Breast & Cervical Cancer Control Navigation Program covers the costs of follow-up medical care for low-income individuals — ages 21 to 64 — whether they have insurance or not. And while the BC3NP does not pay for cancer treatment, individuals diagnosed with breast or cervical cancer may be eligible for a special Medicaid program that does.

Available in select areas of the state, the WISEWOMAN Program can help you understand your chronic disease risk factors and make healthy lifestyle choices.
