

## What is PrEP?

Pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) is medicine taken to prevent getting HIV. It reduces the chance of getting HIV from sharing injection equipment (i.e., needles, syringes, cookers, etc.) by at least 74% and from sex by about 99%.

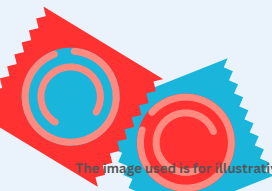
## How do I know if PrEP is right for me?

PrEP is for people who do not have HIV but have a chance of getting it. If you are having sex without condoms or sharing injection equipment, even occasionally, PrEP is recommended for you.



## I've decided PrEP is right for me, what now?

- Discuss your options with a PrEP Navigator or your health care provider.
- To maximize effectiveness, take your medication as prescribed.
- PrEP does not protect against other sexually transmitted infections (STIs) or other bloodborne illnesses, such as hepatitis B and C.

# PrEP

In people who share injection equipment, PrEP pills reduce the chance of getting HIV by at least 74% when taken as prescribed. Currently, PrEP injectables are not recommended for people who share injection equipment.
