

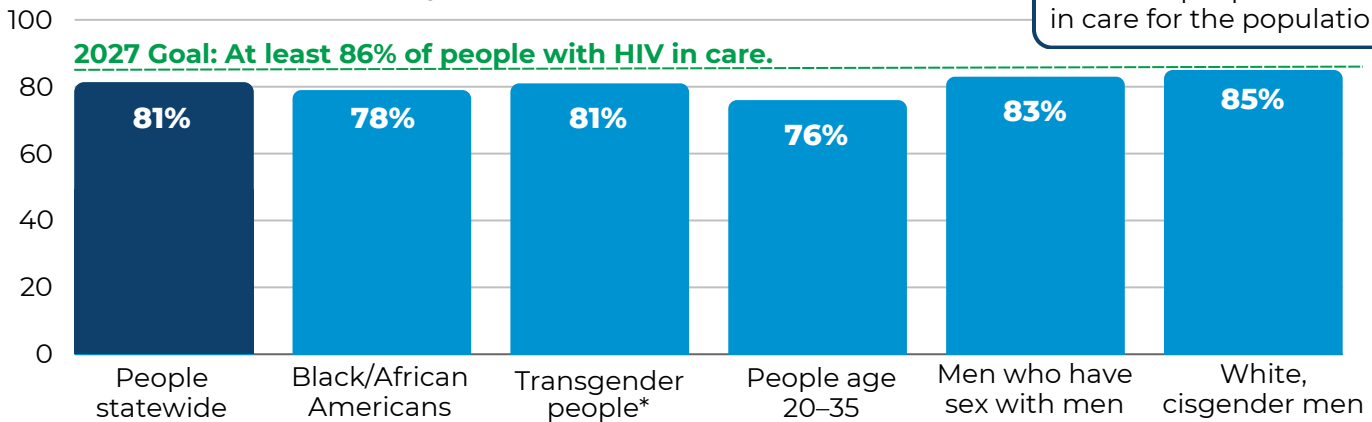
Ending HIV Together

Goal Two

Priority Topic: HIV Care

A central goal of Michigan's Equitable Plan is to improve the rate of people with HIV in ongoing care and treatment. **The goal is to increase the rate to 86% by 2027**, a 5% increase from the 2022 baseline.

What am I looking at?
The **higher** the percentage, the more people with HIV are in care for the population.

Activities in Michigan's Equitable Plan to Increase Retention of People with HIV in Ongoing Care

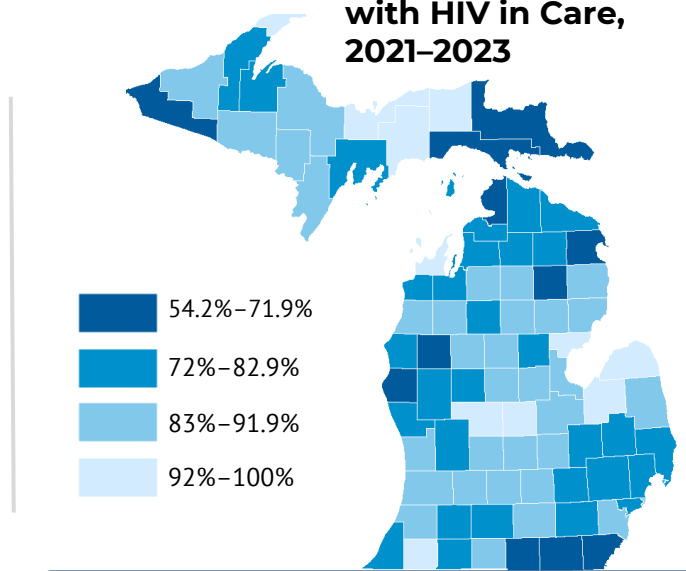
Reduce barriers to care by providing innovative health care solutions, such as offering access to medications and case management to those who are underinsured or uninsured, linkage to care services and wraparound services.

Destigmatize patient care experiences and reduce medical mistrust through provider trainings on topics such as cultural humility, diversity and sexual orientation, and by updating health education with nonstigmatizing language.

Address the social determinants of health through partnerships with organizations focused on housing, transportation, environment and other needs to reduce barriers for patients.

*Due to data limitations, MDHHS is often unable to confirm that someone identifies as transgender unless they are retained in care. This means individuals who identify as transgender but are not retained in care are undercounted, potentially inflating this rate.

Areas shaded in darker blue have a lower proportion of people with HIV in care and represent possible opportunities for increased focus.
