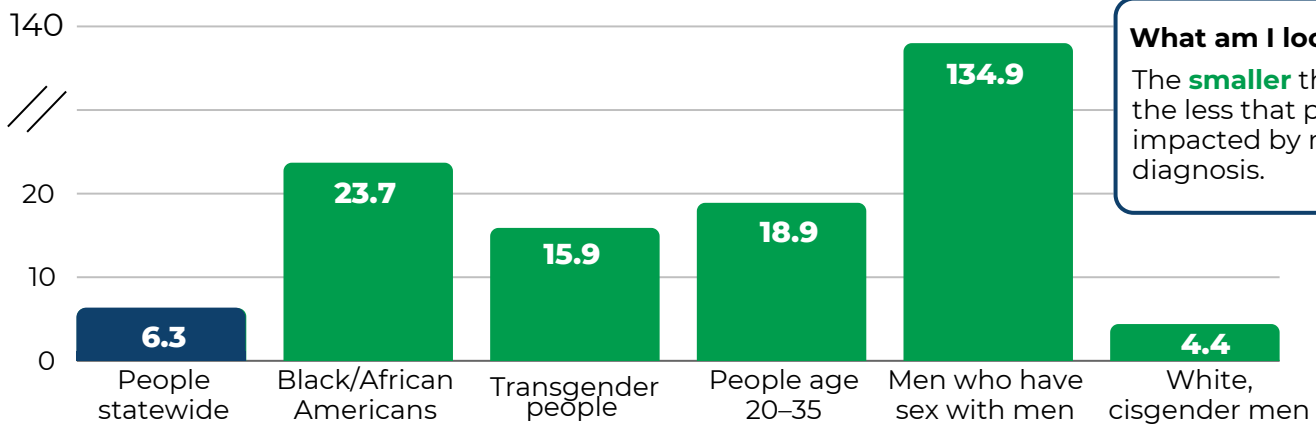


Ending HIV Together

Priority Topic: HIV New Diagnosis

Michigan's Equitable Plan is an effort by the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) to **reduce new HIV diagnoses by 90% by 2030.**

Rate of New HIV Diagnosis per 100,000 People, 2022



What am I looking at?
The **smaller** the number, the less that population is impacted by new HIV diagnosis.

Activities in Michigan's Equitable Plan to Reduce New Diagnoses

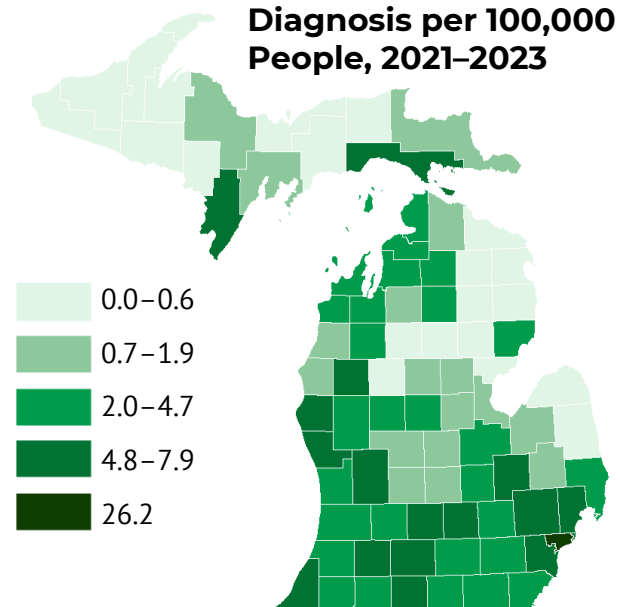
Expand access to HIV testing through routine testing in emergency departments, mobile testing sites and at-home test kits. Testing strategies also integrate sexually transmitted infections (STIs) and viral hepatitis.

Address the social determinants of health through partnerships with organizations focused on housing, transportation, environment and other needs to reduce barriers to care for patients.

Partner with providers, health systems, community organizations, pharmacists and others to develop and improve clinical best practices for HIV prevention and care.

Increase coordination and sharing of best practices from HIV network detection and response efforts across sectors.

What am I looking at?
Areas shaded in darker green have higher rates of new HIV diagnoses. Areas shaded in lighter green have lower rates and are less impacted by HIV.
