

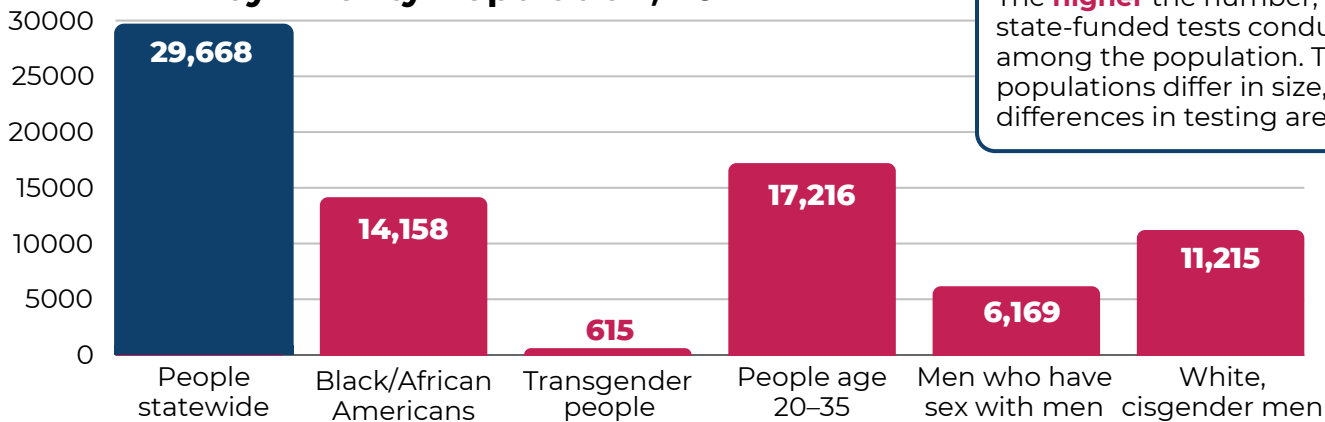
Ending HIV Together

Goal One

Priority Topic: HIV Testing

A central goal of **Michigan's Equitable Plan** is to increase the number of people tested for HIV statewide. The goal is to increase from **29,668 state-funded tests in 2022 to 32,800 in 2027**, with an emphasis on priority populations.

What am I looking at?

The **higher** the number, the more state-funded tests conducted among the population. These populations differ in size, so differences in testing are expected.

Activities in Michigan's Equitable Plan to Improve HIV Testing

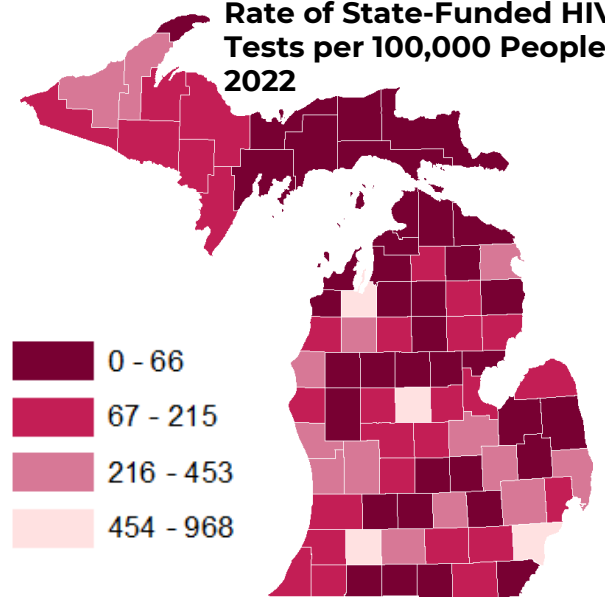
Expand access to HIV testing through routine testing in emergency departments, mobile testing sites and at-home test kits. Testing strategies also integrate sexually transmitted infections (STIs) and viral hepatitis.

Partner with providers, health systems, community organizations, syringe service programs and other groups to improve access for HIV and STI testing.

Train health care professionals in HIV and STI testing, cultural sensitivity and other topics to promote respectful sexual health care and reduce stigma.

Prioritize testing needs for populations such as men who have sex with men, adolescents, pregnant persons and other populations as they emerge.

Areas shaded in lighter pink have more tests reaching that community. Areas shaded in darker pink represent possible opportunities for increased testing outreach.
