Provider Considerations for Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP)

Pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) is prescribed in primary and other health care settings to prevent HIV acquisition among individuals of all genders and sexualities, residing anywhere in Michigan. CDC recommends providers inform all sexually active people about PrEP and that providers offer PrEP to patients who ask.

2021 CDC Guidance, Indications for PrEP:

- Use of injection equipment with partner(s) with HIV, other sexually transmitted infections (STIs) or of unknown HIV status.
- Any condomless anal or vaginal sex in the past six months with partner(s) of unknown HIV status, detectable HIV viral load or have been diagnosed with an STI in the past six months.
- Prior prescription of post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP).
- Patients requesting PrEP, even when no specific sexual or injection behaviors are elicited.

PrEP is Effective

PrEP, when taken as prescribed, reduces the chance of HIV acquisition by 99% for sexual transmission and 74% for intravenous drug use transmission.



Bloodstream Levels Build Up Quickly

People are protected from HIV acquisition through anal sex after 1 week and vaginal sex after 3 weeks.



PrEP is Convenient

PrEP is administered as a daily oral tablet or every two months by long acting injectable.



Routinely Monitor PrEP Use

After PrEP initiation, providers order HIV and STI tests every two to three months to be completed prior to follow-up visits.

PrEP is a primary care preventive service that should be offered by any prescriber who cares for people without HIV.
