## Work Plan Objective Progress and Highlights:

### Injury Prevention

**Objective:** The Region 3 Trauma Network will collaborate to provide injury prevention programs to both inner-city and rural locations based on current needs in the region.

**Progress:** The Region 3 Injury Prevention staff continue to provide collaborative ongoing injury prevention programs across the region. At the Annual Region 3 Trauma Symposium, one of the topics titled “Trauma Recovery Centers-Bridging the Gap Between Victim and Victor” was presented to a large audience with great interest.

### Communications

**Objective:** The Region 3 Trauma Network will meet with the regional 911 directors to discuss the regional 911 dispatch infrastructure and the integration of regional trauma protocols into the regional 911 system.

**Progress:** A pilot program recently began in one of the region’s 911 center. The program involves placing a staff member from the county’s Community Health Access Program within the 911 call center to reduce unneeded EMS responses. When the 911 call taker determines that there is no need for EMS to respond, the CHAP staff member assists the caller in finding the resources they may need such as food or utility assistance. Some performance metrics have been discussed to measure the programs performance. We look forward to learning more about this innovative collaborative effort.

### Infrastructure

**Objective:** The Region 3 RPSRO will develop a process to evaluate the effectiveness of the trauma triage and destination criteria to ensure the transport of trauma patients to the appropriate trauma facility.

**Progress:** The Region 3 RPSRO and Trauma Triage and Destination Subcommittee continue to meet and discuss the region’s current protocol, upcoming ACS trauma triage guidelines and the state of Michigan EMS protocols. Using EMS data via Biospatial a template report has been drafted and sample reports have been discussed along with challenges in EMS data points such as “destination determination”. EMS

education and communication regarding EMS documentation is ongoing.

### Regional Performance Improvement

**Objective:** The Region 3 RPSRO will utilize appropriate data reports to improve regional system performance improvement based on the availability of the data.

**Progress:** The Region 3 RPSRO utilizes the RPSRO Inventory to monitor metrics such as ED dwell times, the designation status of facilities within the region, total number of incidents and how these compare to previous reports. The Region 3 RPSRO also reviews and discusses the annual MTQIP report and how the collaborative data may help drive regional performance improvement efforts.

### Other relevant information:

The Region 3 Education Subcommittee recently held its Annual Region 3 Trauma Symposium. The symposium consisted of eight multi-disciplinary speakers discussing current trauma related topics. The trauma symposium provided 5 CME credits and 6 EMS Continuing Education Credits. Approximately 275 nurses, EMS, physicians and mental health workers attended this year including some out of state attendees. The reviews and comments have been quite favorable for the event. Vendors were able to display and showcase their products during scheduled breaks. The event also gives regional partners a chance to meet and network together from small rural facilities to larger academic receiving centers that they regularly transfer patients to.
