- i) Transportation expenses to and from medical providers for ongoing medically necessary treatment are included as administrative costs of the Title XIX Program.
- i) Transportation expenses to and from medical providers for dual (Medicare/Medicaid) eligibles are included as administrative costs of the Title XIX program.
- k) Related travel expenses, including meals, lodging, and an attendant, are reimbursed if necessary to obtain medical services, and are included as an administrative cost.
- Transportation services are requested through county DHHS offices. DHHS screens requests and approves the least costly, most appropriate mode of transportation available to meet the beneficiary's need, including, as appropriate, commercial, public, and not-for-profit providers and agencies.
- m) INDIVIDUAL DRIVERS MUST HAVE A VALID DRIVER'S LICENSE TO RECEIVE TRANSPORTATION PAYMENT, WHICH IS CONFIRMED THROUGH ATTESTATION TO COUNTY DHHS OFFICES OR SCREENING.
- n) EXCLUDING PUBLIC TRANSIT AUTHORITY AND BENEFICIARIES, TRANSPORTATION PROVIDERS AND INDIVIDUAL DRIVERS WILL NOT RECEIVE TRANSPORTATION PAYMENT IF EXCLUDED FROM PARTICIPATING IN ANY FEDERAL HEALTH CARE PROGRAM OR LISTED ON THE INSPECTOR GENERAL OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES EXCLUSION LIST, WHICH IS CONFIRMED THROUGH ATTESTATION TO COUNTY DHHS OFFICES OR SCREENING. ADDITIONALLY, INDIVIDUAL DRIVERS (EXCLUDING PUBLIC TRANSIT AUTHORITY AND BENEFICIARIES) MUST ATTEST TO COUNTY DHHS OFFICES OR BE SCREENED FOR CONVICTION UNDER FEDERAL AND STATE DRUG LAW. INDIVIDUAL DRIVERS WHO ARE NOT SCREENED MUST NOTIFY COUNTY DHHS OFFICES OF ANY FELONY CONVICTION RELATING TO A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE AND TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS.

RE: Notice of Intent to Submit a State Plan Amendment (SPA) to Include New Transportation Provider Qualifications

This letter, in compliance with Section 1902(a)(73) and Section 2107(e)(1)(C) of the Social Security Act, serves as notice to all Tribal Chairs and Health Directors of the intent by the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) to submit a Medicaid SPA request to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS).

Based on CMS guidance issued on July 12, 2021, states must submit a SPA to describe the mechanism it will use to ensure non-emergency medical transportation (NEMT) providers and individual drivers meet transportation provider requirements set by the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021. The SPA will require family members and foster parents of beneficiaries and taxicab drivers to meet new qualifications in order to receive Medicaid reimbursement for providing transportation services. The Act statutorily requires Medicaid transportation providers and individual drivers to not be excluded from participating in federal health care programs, included on the MDHHS sanctioned provider and U.S. Department of Health and Human Services exclusion lists, or convicted of a felony criminal offense relating to a controlled substance. Providers will be required to report any felony conviction relating to a controlled substance and traffic violations.

The Act requires these provider qualifications to ensure program integrity. This SPA may impact Native American beneficiaries who receive transportation from family members or foster parents who do not meet the statutorily required qualifications. Drivers who do not meet these qualifications will not receive Medicaid reimbursement for providing transportation services. The anticipated effective date of this SPA is October 1, 2021.

There is no public hearing scheduled for this SPA. Input regarding this SPA is highly encouraged, and comments regarding this notice of intent may be submitted to Lorna Elliott-Egan, MDHHS Liaison to the Michigan tribes. Lorna can be reached at 517-512-4146, or via email at Elliott-EganL@michigan.gov. Please provide all input by October 14, 2021.

In addition, MDHHS is offering to set up group or individual consultation meetings to discuss the SPA, according to the tribes' preference. Consultation meetings allow tribes the opportunity to address any concerns and voice any suggestions, revisions, or objections to be relayed to the author of the proposal.
