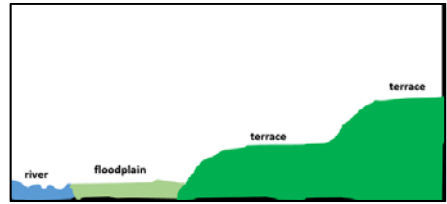
**11
