<p>1 Indigenous</p> <p>the first people in a place</p>	<p>2 Anishinabek</p> <p>some of the first people of the Great Lakes region</p>
<p>3 migration</p> <p>to move from one place to another</p>	<p>4 Anishinaabemowin</p> <p>the language of the Anishinabek</p>
<p>5 culture</p> <p>the way of life of a group of people</p>	<p>6 artifacts</p> <p>things that people made, used and left behind</p> 
<p>7 primary sources</p> <p>documents, images or artifacts that give firsthand evidence of the past</p>	<p>8 secondary sources</p> <p>information that was created by someone who did not experience the past firsthand</p>
<p>9 archaeology</p> <p>the study of things that people made, used and left behind</p>	<p>10 archaeologist</p> <p>someone who digs up and studies things that people made, used and left behind.</p> 

<p>11 floodplain</p> <p>an area of low ground next to a river</p> 	<p>12 terrace</p> <p>a step-like landform</p> 
<p>13 feature</p> <p>traces of human activity that are in the ground</p>	<p>14 Fire-Cracked Rock (FCR)</p> <p>rock that has been exposed to extreme heat, causing it to break</p> 
<p>15 hearth</p> <p>a fire pit often used to cook or smoke food</p> 	<p>16 cache pit</p> <p>a storage pit</p>
<p>17 basin</p> <p>a bowl-shaped hole in the ground</p>	<p>18 projectile points</p> <p>the sharp end of an arrow, spear or knife</p> 
<p>19 pottery</p> <p>pots, dishes and other articles made of clay</p> 	<p>20 sovereignty</p> <p>the power of a nation to make decisions on its own lands</p>
