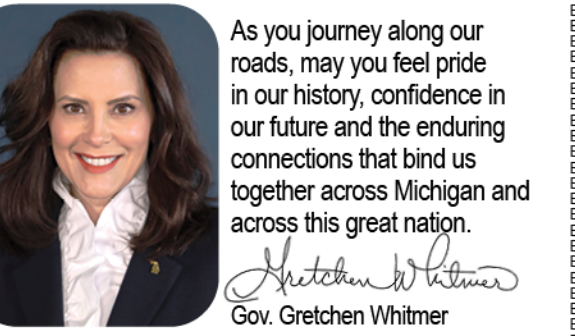

GO HANDS-FREE. JUST DRIVE. IT'S THE LAW.

It is illegal to manually use a cell phone or other mobile electronic device while operating a vehicle on Michigan roads. Under the law, a driver cannot hold or support a phone or other device with any part of their hands, arms or shoulders.

You can use hands-free technology such as Bluetooth or integrated systems within the vehicle as long as you do not manually use the system. Anything more than a single touch is against the law.

KNOW YOUR LOAD HEIGHT

Overheight vehicle bridge crashes can cause serious injuries, major damage and traffic delays.

Permits are required for vehicles or loads higher than 13 feet, 6 inches.
