



2026 MDOT Advanced Training Wheels Bicycle Facility Design Training

Lansing: 8:30-5 p.m. Aug. 20
Ann Arbor: 8:30-5 p.m. Sept. 10

This in-person course covers the newest planning and design guidelines for developing on and off-road bicycle facilities. This year, the training will include a walking tour to explore existing facilities, highlights from state and national guidance, showcases of bicycle facilities in Michigan communities, and analysis of various types of bicycle accommodations, including shared-use paths, separated bike lanes and buffered bike lanes.

- Target Audience:** This course is for city, county and Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) managers, engineers, planners, elected officials, downtown development authority (DDA) staff, economic development staff, township officials, chambers of commerce and other partners who can help educate people about active transportation bicycle facilities.
- Education Credits:** Engineers may be eligible for Continuing Education Hours. Planners may self-report for Certification Maintenance hours.
- Please Note:** Class is intended to have an hour-long walking tour.
