<u>Public schools, nonprofit charter schools, and school districts</u> can qualify for licensing and shall submit the following information in the name of the organization prior to being approved to conduct a millionaire party event.

- 1. A detailed purpose letter on organization letterhead, signed and dated by the Principal Officer, indicating the main source(s) of funds received, the main use(s) of funds expended, and the specific purpose of the organization
- 2. A copy of the organization's annual financial statements including the income statement and balance sheet information for the previous three years. (If the organization does not have financial statements prepared separate from the district's financial statements, the district's financial statements are required.)
- 3. A copy of the organization's bank statements for the previous twelve months. (If the organization's information is part of the district's financial information, submit bank statements for all accounts utilized by the applying organization.)
- 4. A copy of the organization's check register for the previous twelve months. (If the organization's information is part of the district's financial information, submit check register information for all accounts utilized by the applying organization.)
- 5. A copy of the organization's credit card and procurement card statements for the previous twelve months. (If the organization's information is part of the district's financial information, submit credit card and procurement card statements for all accounts utilized by the applying organization.)

- 1. A detailed purpose letter on organization letterhead, signed and dated by the Principal Officer, indicating the main source(s) of funds received, the main use(s) of funds expended, and the specific purpose of the organization
- 2. A signed and dated copy of the organization's current bylaws or constitution, including membership criteria
- 3. A complete copy of the organization's articles of incorporation that have been filed with the Corporations and Securities Bureau, if the organization is incorporated
- 4. A provision in the bylaws, constitution, or articles of incorporation indicating that all assets, real property, and personal property will revert to the local government or another nonprofit organization should the organization dissolve.
- 5. A copy of the letter from the IRS stating the organization is exempt from federal tax under IRS code 501(c). (If the organization is not exempt under 501(c), submit a copy of one bank statement per year for the previous five years.)
- 6. A copy of the organization's annual financial statements including the income statement and balance sheet information for the previous three years.
- 7. A copy of the organization's annual tax returns for the previous three years (e.g. 990, 990-EZ, or 990-N e-Postcard)
- 8. A copy of the organization's bank statements for the previous twelve months
- 9. A copy of the organization's check register for the previous twelve months
- 10. A copy of the organization's credit card and procurement card statements for the previous twelve months
