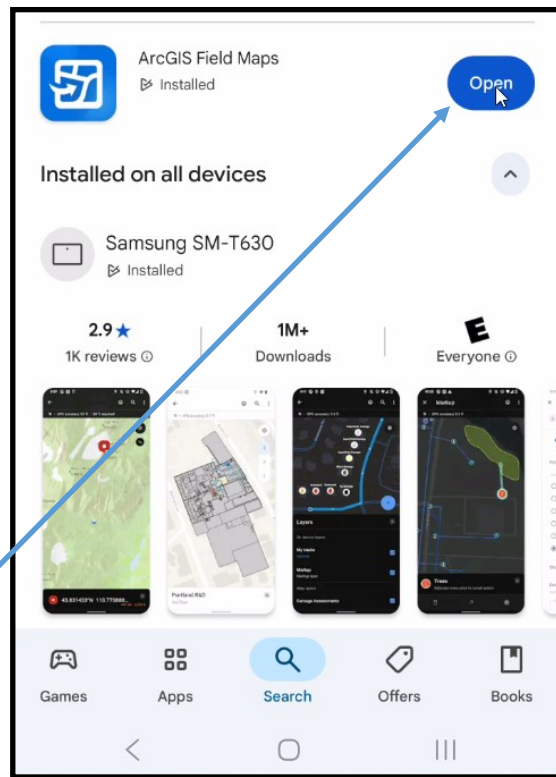
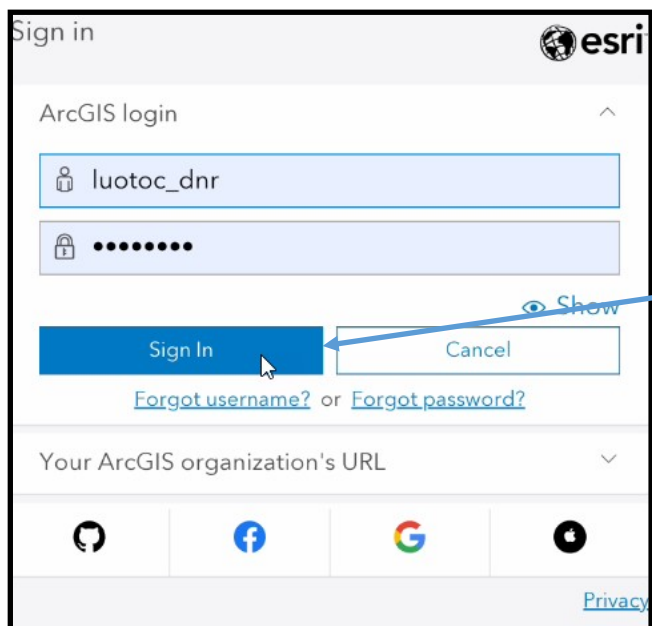


1. From the Play Store, install ArcGIS Field Maps

2. Tap on Field Maps.



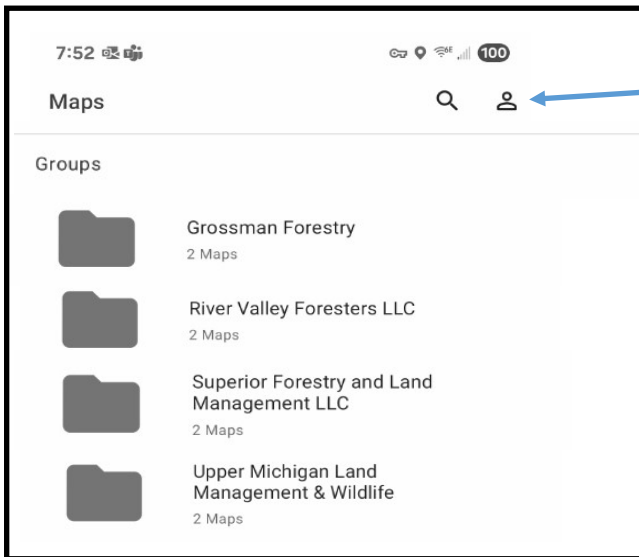
3. Tap on Sign in with ArcGIS Online.



4. Enter your ArcGIS Online username and password then tap Sign In.

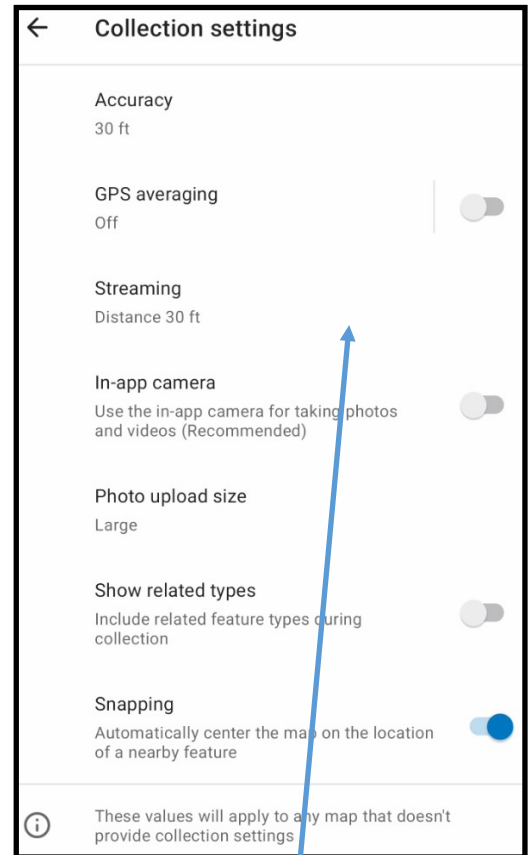


Field Maps Initial Settings

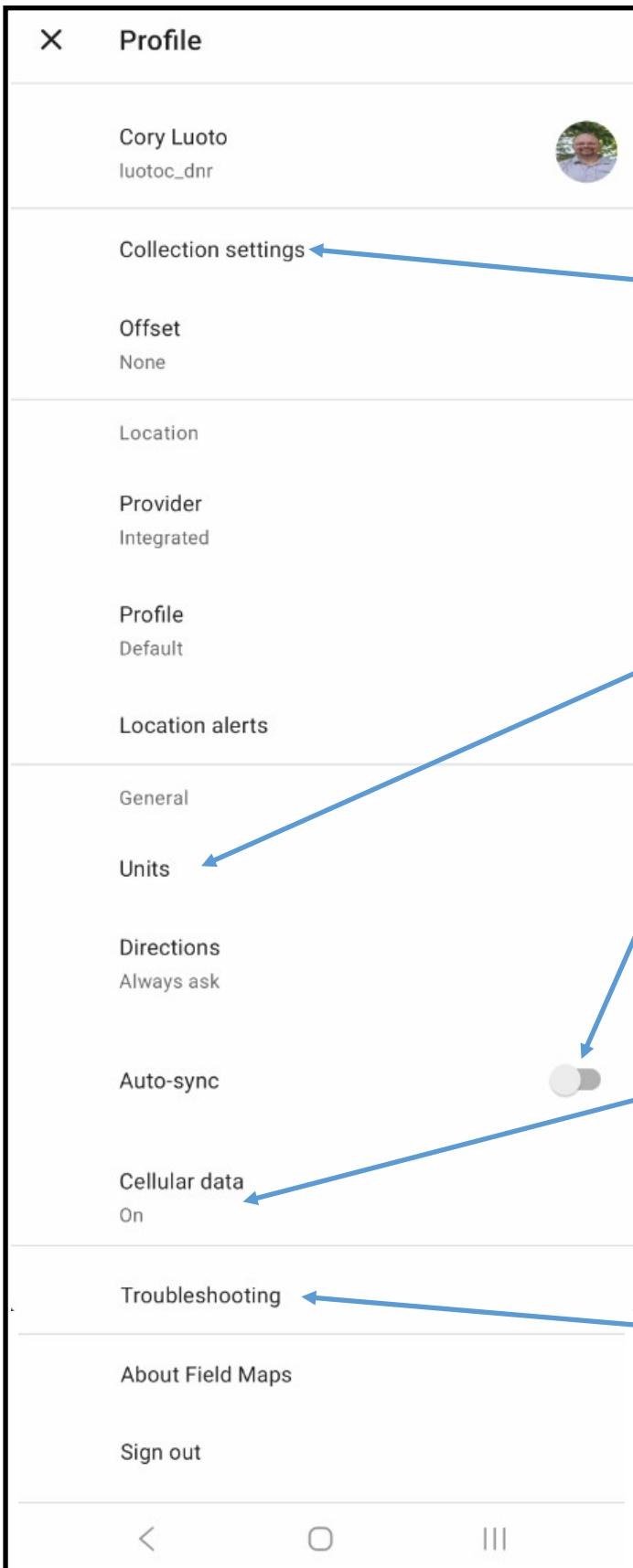


1. Tap on the user icon in the upper right corner.

2. Tap on Collection settings. Change your Collection Settings to match above.

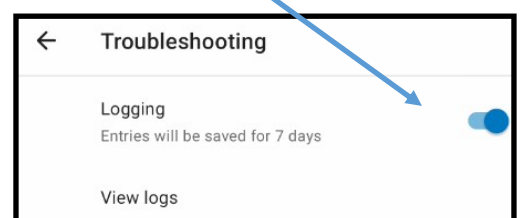
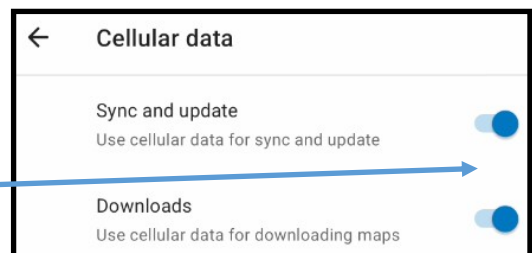
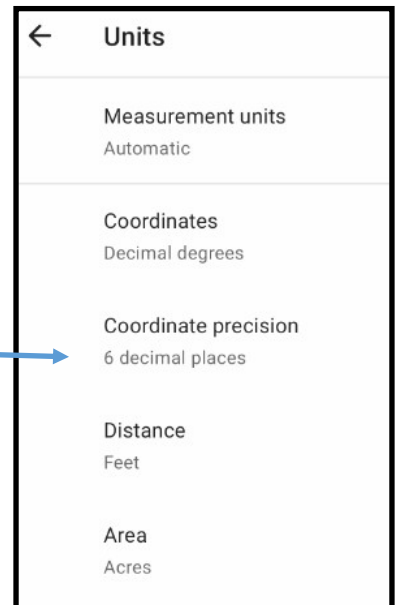


3. Tap on Units and set them to match to the right.

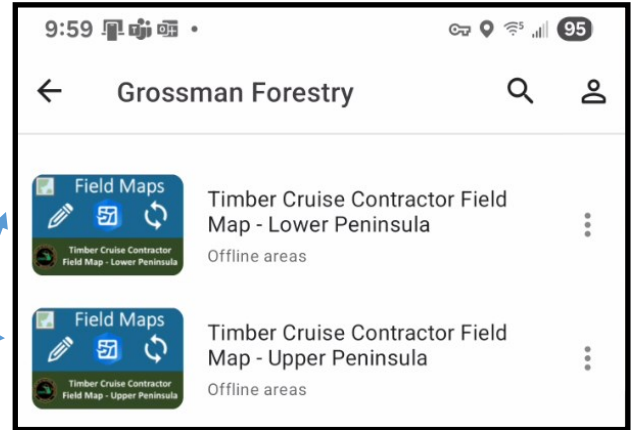
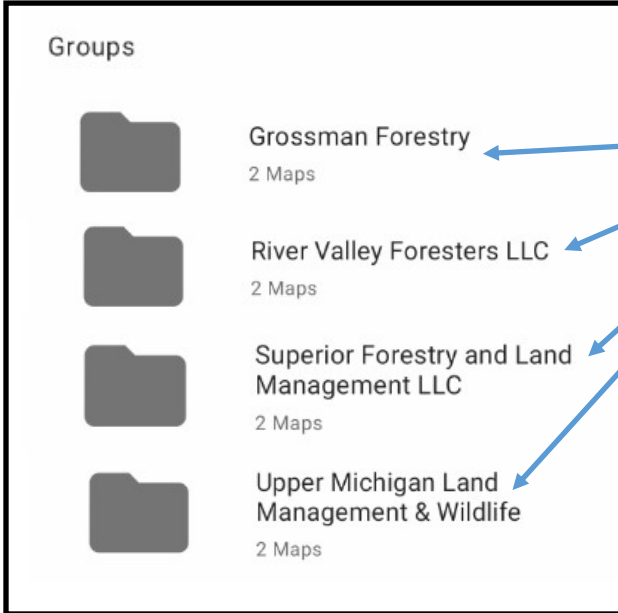
4. Auto Sync should be turned Off. **Failing to do this will result in poor device battery life.**

5. If you want to download and Sync updates in the field, Cellular Data needs to be turned On.

6. Tap on Troubleshooting and ensure Logging is turned on. If there is an issue with the app, the log can be shared for troubleshooting.

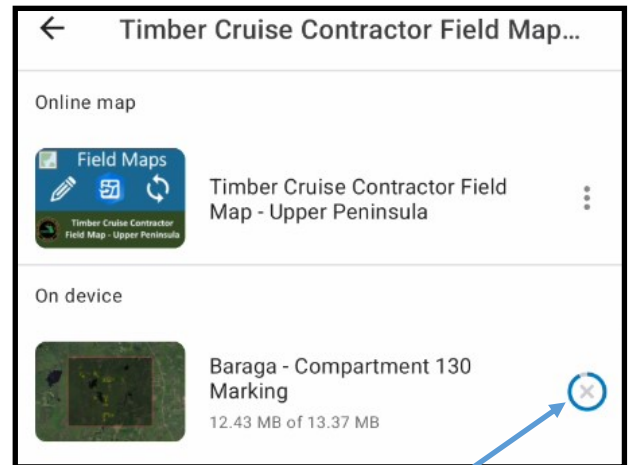
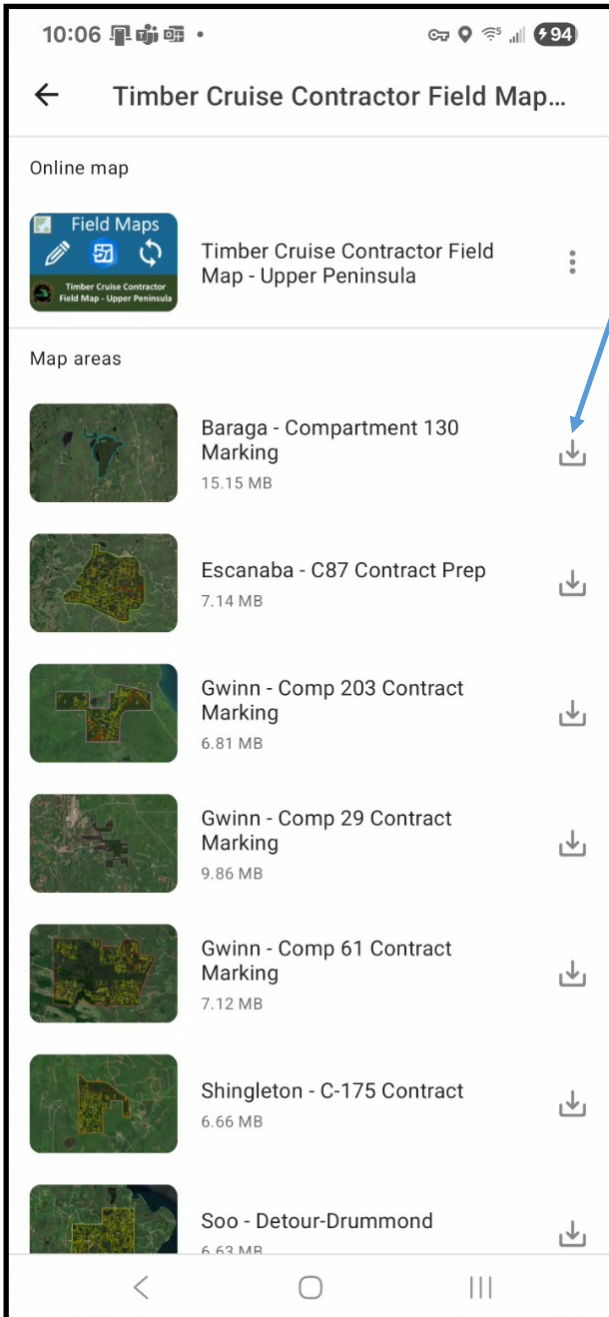


Downloading Offline Maps



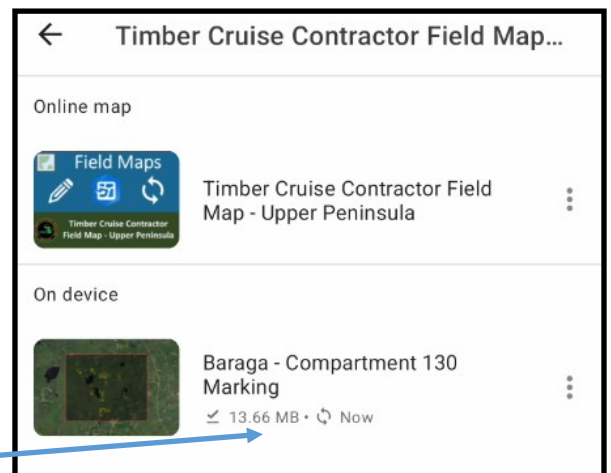
3. Tap the download icon next to the sale you will be working on.

4. The map will start downloading. Download progress is marked by the circular status line.

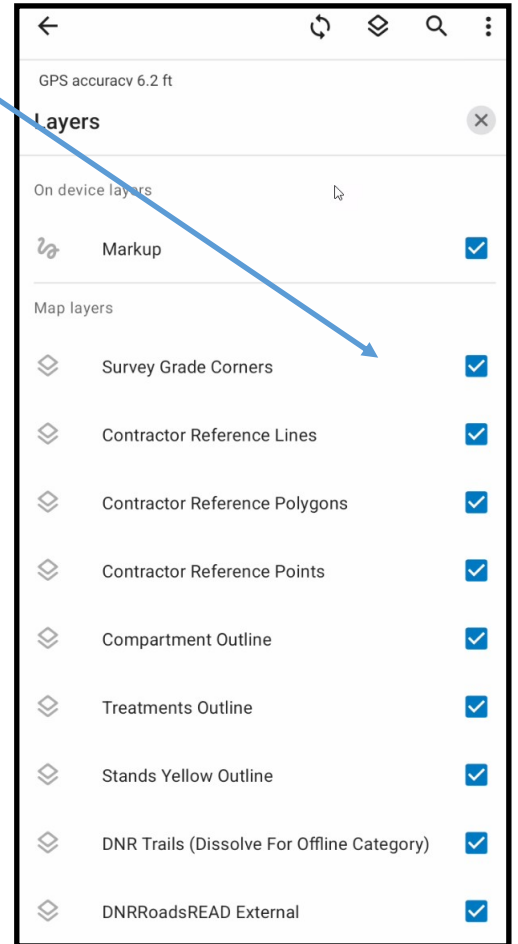
5. Once the map is downloaded, you will see the check and size of the map.



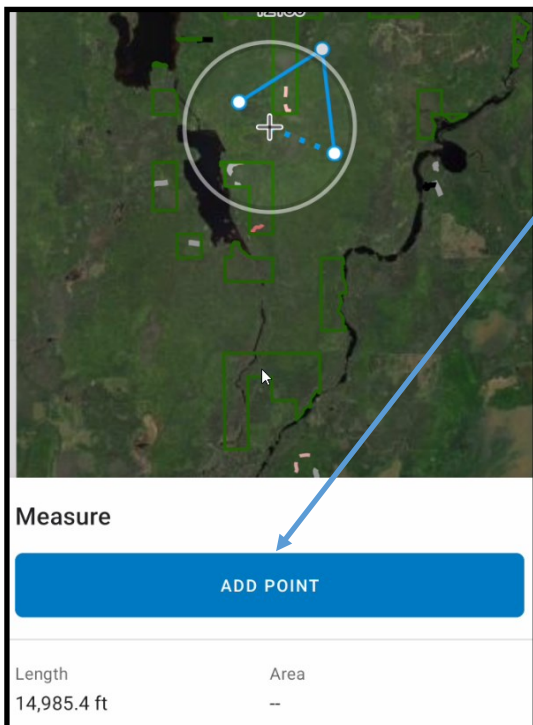
Map Widgets



Layers can be turned off and on to suit your mapping needs.



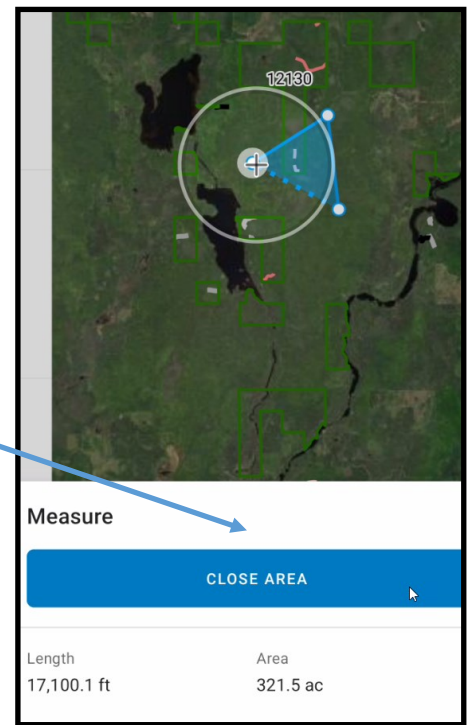
Main Menu
(Three dots)



The one tool you may use in the Main Menu is the Measure Tool.

To use this, place the cursor of the first point that you want to measure and then tap Add Point. Then pan the map to the second point you want to measure to and then tap Add Point again. This can be done as many times that you want.

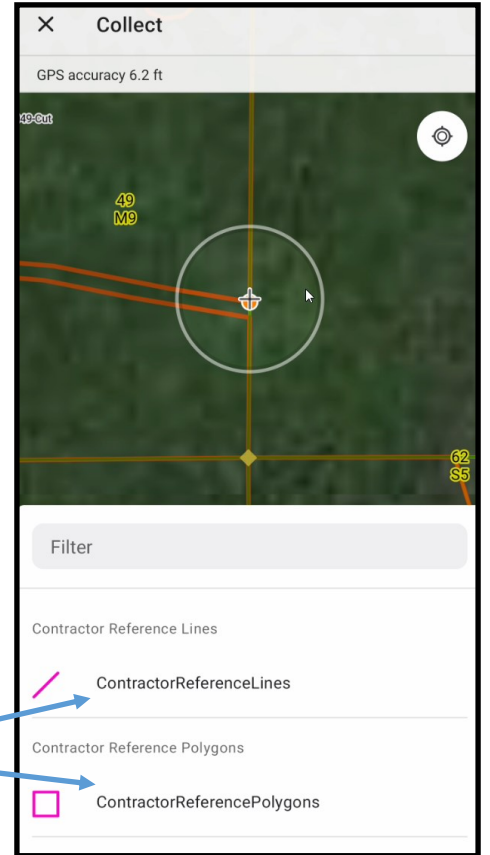
To get the acres around an area, tap around the feature by moving the cursor and adding points. Then bring the cursor back to the starting point and tap Close Area. This will then provide an acreage.



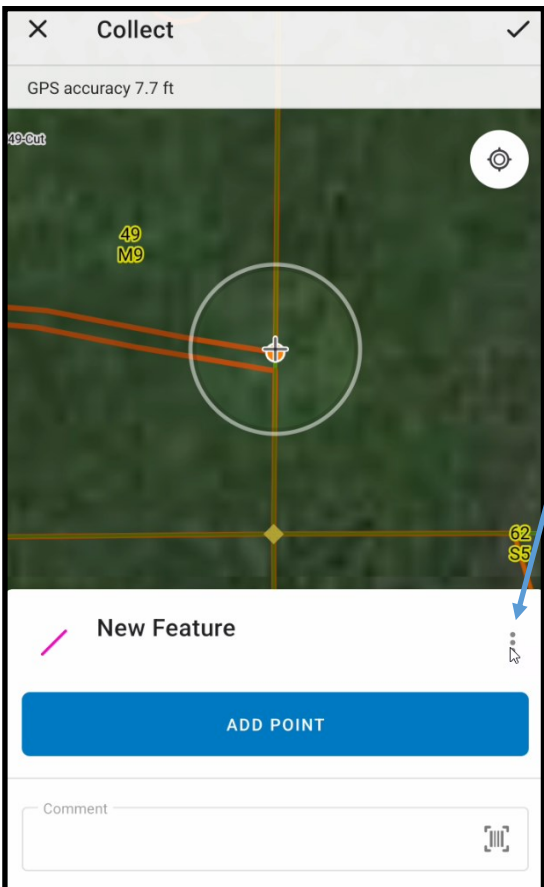
GPSing a Feature



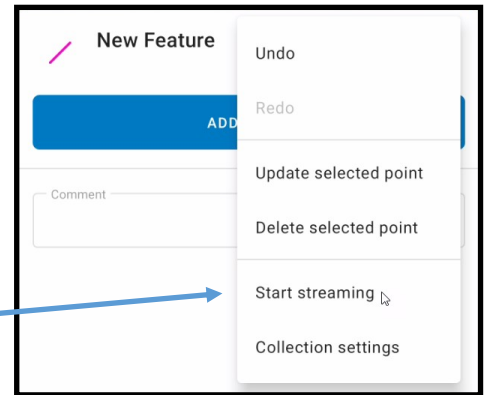
1. Tap on blue + Circle in the lower left.



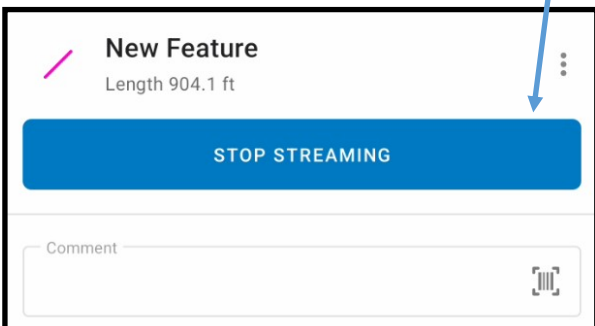
2. Tap on the feature you are going to GPS (Point, Line or Polygon)



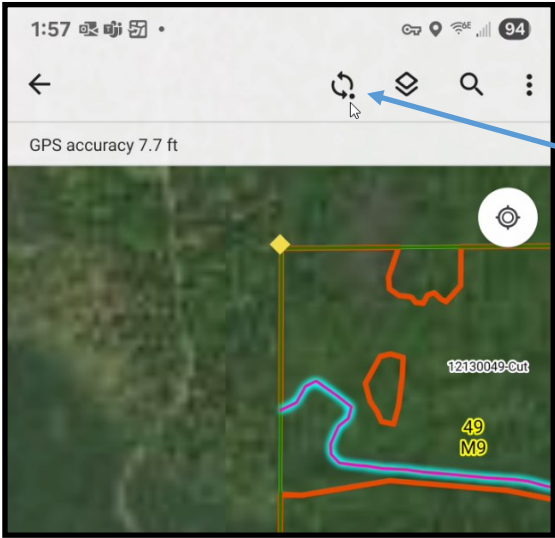
3. It will immediately GPS a point where you are standing. Tap on the three dots and then tap on Start Streaming.



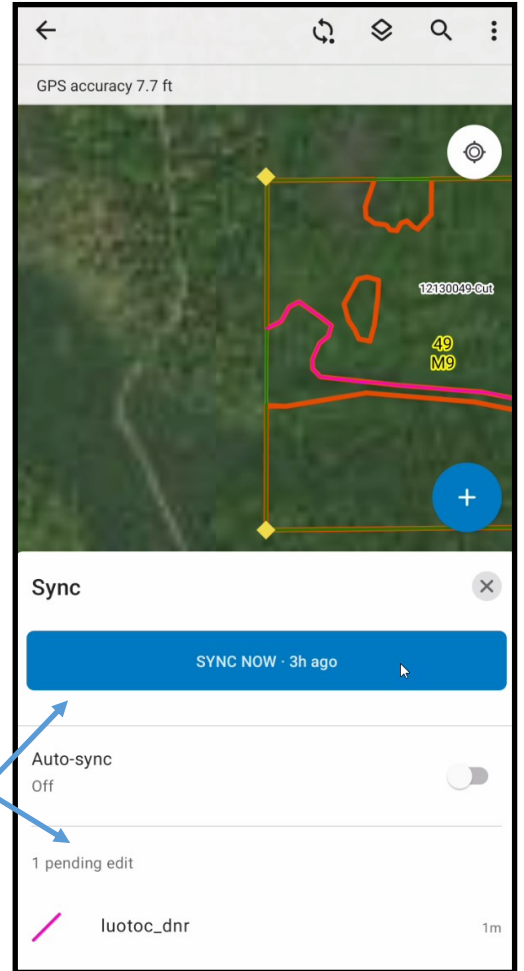
4. After you are done GPSing the feature, tap Stop Streaming. Then tap the check in the upper right corner to submit the GPSed feature.



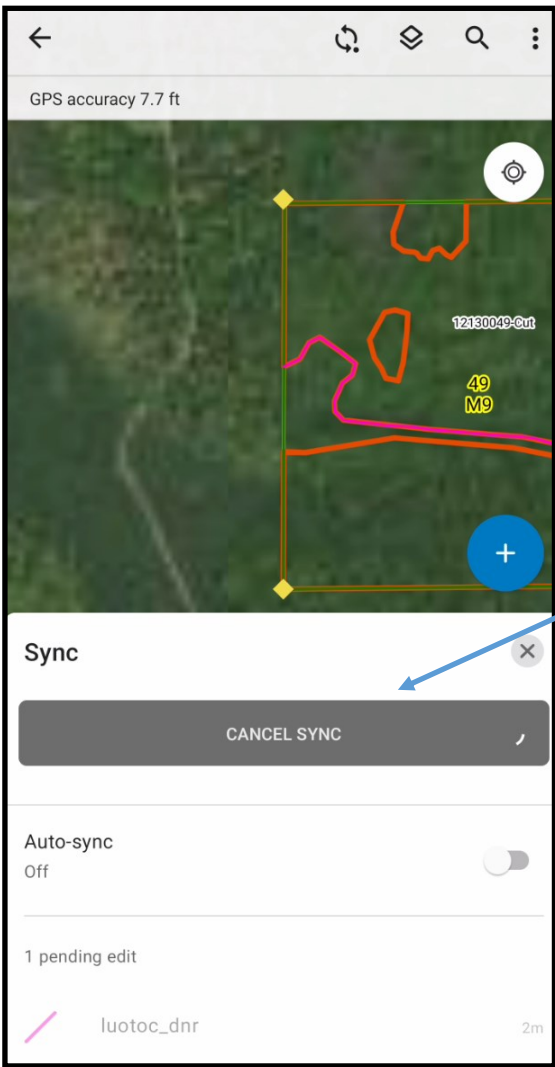
Syncing GPSed Features



1. To Sync the GPSed features, tap the Sync icon.



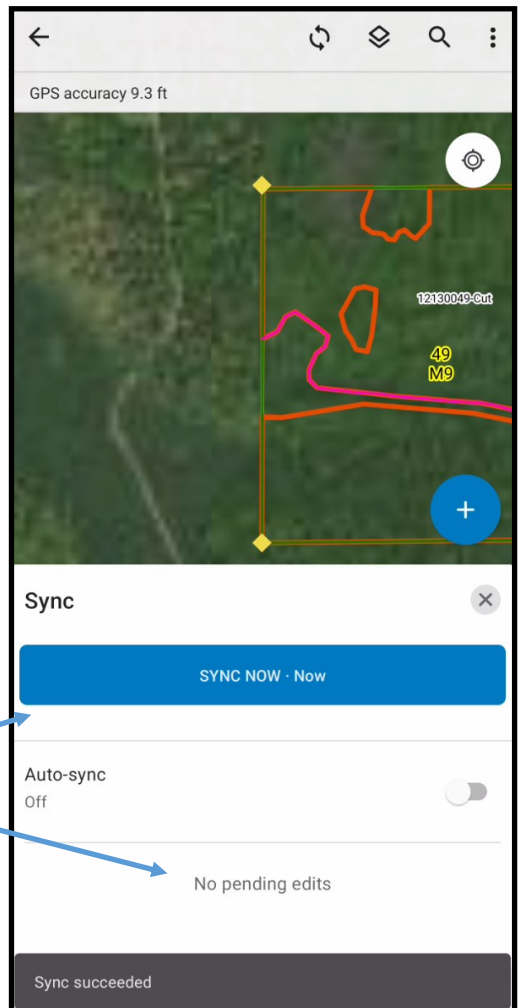
2. The Sync window will open. It will show how many features you have collected.



3. Tap Sync Now.

In order to Sync, ensure you have three or more bars of cell signal or are connected to Wi-Fi.

4. While the feature is Syncing, the bar will turn grey and say Cancel Sync.



5. After a successful Sync, it will now display Sync Now and there will no longer be Pending Edits.
