Gogebic County was organized in 1887. The county coordinates are Ranges 38 West through 48 West (38W-48W) and Townships 42 North through 50 North (42N-50N). Adjacent counties include Ontonagon (north), Iron (east), Vilas [WI] (south), and Iron [WI] (southwest). Lake Superior is the north border of Gogebic County.

Original records from Gogebic County are available at the Archives of Michigan. The list below is organized by record type; each record type lists specific records, the years of coverage and the record group (RG) number assigned to that collection. A more detailed list of each collection can be found in finding aids at the archives.
