ARCHIVES OF MICHIGAN



First organized in 1861 as Bleeker County, Menominee County was reorganized and renamed in 1863 as Menominee County. The county coordinates are Ranges 24 West through 29 West (24W-29W) and Townships 31 North through 41 North (31N-41N). Adjacent counties include Marquette (north), Delta (northeast), Marinette [WI] (west), and Dickinson (northwest). Lake Michigan is on the south border of Menominee County.

Original records from Menominee County are available at the Archives of Michigan.
