



The Michigan Transportation Asset Management Council acts as a resource for independent objective data on the condition of Michigan's roads and bridges and a resource for implementing the concepts of asset management.

Strategic Plan

The TAMC continues to promote the principles of asset management statewide to enhance the productivity of investing in Michigan's roads and bridges through coordination and collaboration among state and local transportation agencies.

The TAMC's Activities Include:

- Surveying and reporting the condition of roads and bridges by functional classification categories.
- Analyzing completed and planned investments in roads and bridges.
- Supporting the development of appropriate asset management methodologies.
- Providing education and training on the benefits of asset management principles and procedures.

TAMC Related Legislation:

The TAMC was formed under PA 499 of 2002 (amended by PA 338 of 2006, PA 199 of 2007, PA 257 of 2010, PA 298 of 2012, PA 506 of 2012 and PA 323, PA 324, PA 325 of 2018.) and is required to prepare an annual report detailing its activities during the previous year, and its plans for the upcoming year.
