## Voting districts drawn a new way—by the people, for the people

The mission of the Michigan Independent Citizens Redistricting Commission (MICRC) is to make democracy in Michigan work better by drawing new boundaries for election districts.

Redistricting means drawing fair maps that decide which areas and groups are represented by the people we elect to office.

Drawing fair district maps directly affects who is working for us and what happens in our communities.

In drawing new lines, the Commission uses [specific criteria](#) including population, geography, diversity, partisan fairness, and community cohesion.

Telling Commissioners what you think about the maps is how your interests get represented.

Voters have at least three chances to show up and speak up about which Senate district map works best for their community of interest.
