They adopted a law that would change the Open Meetings Act for a certain defined period of time that will get into to allow some public to allow all public bodies to 663 02:49:39.840 --> 02:49:50.850 To be able to conduct a meeting virtually that was booted out of both again the house in the senate earlier this week it was referred to the governor on Friday, the governor signed it on Friday. 664 02:49:51.780 --> 02:49:59.550 Under the mission constitution bill does not become a law until it is filed by the air which I filed by the governor with the Office of the Great Seal. 665 02:50:00.000 --> 02:50:09.180 That was done yesterday afternoon and I don't know approximately 545 the Open Meetings Act as we've discussed before requires 18 hours notice of the meeting.

The actual medical issue does not and should not, you know, not be included in the note, but there would have

to be a note that says that you were unable to participate in person.
