Home Visiting Training Opportunity: MC3 and Perinatal Mental Health Resources

This opportunity is being shared on behalf of the Michigan Home Visiting Initiative.

Join us to learn about Perinatal Mental Health Resources from our partners at MC3!

Overview: In this session, we will introduce the Michigan Child Collaborative Care Program or MC3 Perinatal program and walk you through the resources that they offer including a perinatal mental health toolkit. The toolkit includes information about perinatal wellness, as well as information on how to develop coping skills to manage strong feelings that come up during the perinatal period. This session is facilitated by Jessica Jenkins and Dr. Samantha Shaw. Dr. Shaw is a board-certified outpatient psychiatrist. She attended Michigan State University for medical school and completed her general psychiatry residency at the University of Michigan. Her area of expertise is women's mental health/perinatal psychiatry, and she is the director of the Perinatal and Reproductive Psychiatry Clinic at Michigan Medicine.
