Instructions for Maternal Infant Health Program (MIHP) Users To Access the Michigan Care Improvement Registry (MCIR) You must have a MiLogin username and password to access MCIR. Note: If you already have a MILogin User ID skip to the Step 2 If you have not yet have a MiLogin ID, please follow the following registration steps for MiLogin Go to the State of Michigan MILogin page using the web address listed below: https://miloqintp.michigan.gov (State of Michigan MILogin page) Click on the SIGN UP button on the bottom. 2. Your MIHP Agency Coordinator must submit the following information via email to milhp@michigan.gov

a. Your first and last name exactly as they appear on your MiLogin Home page
b. Your MiLogin username
c. The email address that you used to register for MiLogin

The MIHP system administrator will add your information to the MCIR Registry Application

3. You will receive an email with a PIN number to the email address you provided in step 2c above. You will use this PIN to request access to the MCIR application.




MIHP MCIR ASSESSMENTS: OVERVIEW

WHAT TO ASSESS: CYCLE 9 REQUIREMENTS



HEARING

- Infant-Specific Components
 - Home Visitor must:
 - Access MCIR to discuss hearing screening results with the family as soon as possible following enrollment but no later than the third professional visit.
 - Document: Record results and follow up in the "other visit information" section on the PVPN.



IMMUNIZATIONS: MATERNAL, DISCUSSION & MCIR

- Maternal-Specific Components
 - Home Visitor must
 - Discuss the maternal beneficiary's immunization status and infant immunizations at least once during the maternal course of care.
 - Document: The checklist of the PVPN
 - The MCIR must be pulled and reviewed at the first visit for all Maternal beneficiaries.
 - Document: Must be located in the chart (or a screen shot of attempts)



IMMUNIZATIONS: INFANT, DISCUSSION

- Infant-Specific Components
 - Home Visitor must
 - Discuss the infant beneficiary's immunization status with the caregiver at every home visit.
 - Discuss the caregiver's immunizations at least once during the course of care.
 - Document: The checklist of the PVPN



IMMUNIZATIONS: INFANT, MCIR

Same timeframe as the MCIR hearing check

- Review the infant's MCIR and include in chart at least twice as follows:
 - I. As soon as possible following enrollment but no later than the third professional visit.
 - 2. At the first professional visit following the infant turning 5 months of age
 - If the infant is older than 5 months of age at enrollment, two separate MCIR reviews are still required (at the first professional visit following enrollment and at least one other professional visit prior to discharge).
 - 3. If the infant remains enrolled beyond 16 months of age, one additional time prior to discharge (for a total of three MCIR record reviews).
 - Document: MCIR must be located in the chart (or a screen shot of attempts)
 - A MCIR pulled at or after discharge does not meet the MCIR documentation requirement.
 - If immunizations are not discussed or the MCIR record is not accessed at the appropriate time, the reason must be documented on the Contact Log.

LEAD: DISCUSSION & MCIR

- Home Visitor must:
 - **Discuss** lead exposure prevention and provide Lead Fact Sheet at **enrollment**.
 - Discuss need for lead screening at 12 months of age at visit that occurs when an infant is between 10 and 12 months of age.
 - If infant continues to receive services beyond 12 months of age, access MCIR.
 - Review lab results with family.
 - Document: Record results and follow up in the "other visit information" section on the PVPN.

MCIR: PUTTING IT ALL TOGETHER

Summary of MCIR timeframes, organized by visit sequence

Visits Requiring MCIR Assessment	Maternal MCIR Assessment	Infant MCIR Assessment	Documentation
First visit following enrollment	Immunizations	Immunizations and Hearing, if available in MCIR (if not, see next row)	Imms: Include MCIR in Chart Hearing: PVPN "other visit information" section
As soon as possible following enrollment but no later than the 3 rd visit	n/a	Immunizations and Hearing	Imms: Include MCIR in Chart Hearing: PVPN "other visit information" section
First visit following infant turning 5 months*	n/a	Immunizations	Include MCIR in Chart
Visit after infant turns 12 months	n/a	Lead	PVPN "other visit information" section
Visit after infant turns 16 months	n/a	Immunizations	Include MCIR in Chart

^{*}If the infant is older than 5 months at enrollment, at least 2 separate immunization MCIR reviews are still required – at the first professional visit following enrollment and at least one other professional visit prior to discharge.

PROTOCOLS FOR HEARING, IMMS, LEAD & MCIR – CYCLE 9

5.4: Immunization, Lead Screening, Hearing Screening, and accessing Michigan Care Improvement Registry (MCIR)

- Protocol describes the process for assessing, discussing, and documenting the following:
 - Immunization status including when MCIR is accessed and printed
 - Hearing screen status/results for infant beneficiaries including:
 - When MCIR is accessed, and results reviewed with caregiver
 - Follow up when needed

Lead

- When prevention and screening discussion occurs
- Timeline for discussion for lead screening
- If infant receives services beyond 12 months of age, access MCIR and assess lead screening results
- Review results with caregiver and follow up when needed

QUALITY ASSESSMENT

Will include questions related to each of the 3 content areas



MCIR-RELATED CERTIFICATION SPECIFICATIONS – CYCLE 9

5.11: MCIR immunization assessment, discussion and documentation required:

- At the first visit for all maternal beneficiaries.
- At least twice during the infant's care as follows:
 - As soon as possible following enrollment but no later than the third professional visit.
 - At first professional visit after 5 months of age for infants (or if enrolled after five months, a second time prior to discharge)
 - If infant remains enrolled beyond 16 months of age, an additional/third MCIR pulled prior to discharge
- MCIR documentation must be in the beneficiary charts (or screen shot of attempts).
- A MCIR pulled at or after discharge does not meet the MCIR documentation requirement.
- If immunization status is not discussed at a given visit or the MCIR is not reviewed at the appropriate timeframe, PVPN or Contact Log must illustrate the reason why.


