Contact Log Requirements

The *Contact Log*, along with *Professional Visit Progress Notes (PVPN)*, provides valuable information about the course of care. A contact log is required in every Maternal Infant Health Program (MIHP) chart, however agencies may use the [Michigan Department of Health and Human Services \(MDHHS\) form 5649](#) or an [agency specific form](#) that includes the required information.

The *Contact Log* must document any program requirement that did not occur during the course of care and explain why. These requirements are listed on [page 19 of the Cycle 9 Operation Guide](#).

Home visitors may document on the *PVPN* why a program requirement did not occur during the course of care. However, when the chart is closed, this information must be transferred to the *Contact Log*.

Providers do not have to list requirements that occurred, as all *PVPNs* will be reviewed for required elements.

EXAMPLE:

When development of a required safety plan is presented, the *POC 2* intervention number for that domain and the beneficiary/caregiver's response to the Safety Plan must be documented (e.g., developed safety plan, declined to develop safety plan) in the Beneficiary Response to Intervention section. If the Home Visitor does not present the Safety Plan under the required circumstances, the reason why must be documented on the *Contact Log*.

2. **The Ripple Effect: An Integrative Framework for Enhancing Trauma-Informed Practice Across Systems with Chandra Ghosh Ippen, PhD**

1. **Overview:** This workshop presents an integrative framework for understanding and communicating across systems about how trauma can affect a child, a family, and a system. The Ripple Effect translates complex trauma concepts using metaphor, visual models, common language, and rich case example. This workshop offers foundational trauma knowledge for providers learning about evidence-based trauma treatments and highlights ways to share trauma theory with family members and across systems (e.g. schools, child welfare workers, mental health, medical practitioners, police) as we work jointly to lessen the impact of trauma exposure.
